A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. (a) Any county of the State with a population
greater than five hundred thousand that receives funding for the
provision of emergency medical services pursuant to section 321 228, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall adopt the recommendations of
the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration for
its emergency medical services system.

7 (b) Any county to which subsection (a) applies shall 8 submit a report of the steps taken to improve efficiency and 9 revenue recovery for emergency medical services to the 10 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 11 the regular session of 2021.

(c) Each county shall conduct an evaluation of the finances and operations of the county's emergency medical services system. Any evaluation conducted pursuant to this Act shall include consultation with other counties of the State regarding any fiscal or operational efficiencies of the

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emergency medical services systems in those counties. Emergency 1 medical services to be examined shall include: 2 3 Community medicine; (1) 4 (2) Public-private partnerships; and 5 (3) Alternatives to emergency medical services 6 transportation in certain nonemergency instances. 7 Each county shall submit a report of its findings and (d) recommendations of the evaluation required under this Act, 8 9 including any proposed legislation, to the legislature and the department of health no later than twenty days prior to the 10 11 convening of the regular session of 2021. 12 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
