A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAUMA-INFORMED APPROACHES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established within the department
2	of educat:	ion for administrative purposes a trauma-informed
3	approach	task force. The task force shall consist of the
4	following	members or their designees:
5	(1)	The superintendent of education, who shall serve as
6		the chairperson of the task force;
7	(2)	The director of human services;
8	(3)	The chairperson of the board of trustees of the office
9		of Hawaiian affairs;
10	(4)	The director of the executive office on early
11		learning;
12	(5)	The chairperson of the Hawaiian homes commission;
13	(6)	The director of business, economic development, and
14		tourism;
15	(7)	The governor;
16	(8)	The president of the senate;
17	(9)	The speaker of the house of representatives;



1	(10)	The	chief justice; and
2	(11)	The	president of the Hawaii state teachers
3		asso	ociation, who shall be invited to be a member of
4		the	task force by the director of human services.
5	(b)	The	task force shall develop a trauma-informed
6	approach	plan	for the department of education. The plan shall
7	include:		
8	(1)	The	requirement for the designation of at least one
9		indi	ividual at each school to:
10		(A)	Oversee the implementation of the trauma-informed
11			approach plan at that school, integrating the
12			coordination of services and professional
13			development into the school's policies; and
14		(B)	Serve as a member of a school's student
15			assistance program team;
16	(2)	A pi	rocess for the coordination of services among:
17		(A)	Students and students' families;
18		(B)	The school; and
19		(C)	County-based services, community care
20			organizations, public health entities, nonprofit
21			youth service providers, community-based

1		organizations, organizations that provide before-
2		or after-school care, and similar groups located
3		in the community;
4	(3)	An indication of how coordinated services are provided
5		based on a trauma-informed approach with an
6		understanding, recognition, and responsiveness to the
7		effects of trauma on education, absenteeism, and
8		school completion, including the secondary impact of
9		trauma on school employees;
10	(4)	Utilization of research-based, research-informed, and
11		culturally specific approaches and national models
12		that are tailored to the community to ensure that data
13		are collected, and the effectiveness of the trauma-
14		informed approaches are determined; and
15	(5)	Professional development and support for principals,
16		vice-principals, and teachers that foster a culture in
17		the school and community that is informed about how to
18		understand, recognize, and respond to trauma and
19		address the impact of trauma on students as a
20		secondary impact on school employees.



1	(c) No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii				
2	Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's participation				
3	as a member of the task force.				
4	(d) The department of education shall provide				
5	administrative support to the task force.				
6	(e) The task force may participate in and collaborate with				
7	any other task force for purposes of this Act.				
8	(f) The task force shall submit its plan and any findings,				
9	recommendations, and proposed legislation to the legislature no				
10	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular				
11	session of 2021.				
12	(g) The task force shall cease to exist on July 1, 2021.				
13	(h) For purposes of this Act:				
14	"Trauma" means results from an event, series of events, or				
15	set of circumstances that are experienced by an individual as				
16	physically or emotionally harmful or threatening and that has				
17	lasting adverse effects on the individual's cognitive				
18	functioning and physical, social, emotional, mental, or				
19	spiritual well-being.

1 that recognizes the signs and symptoms of trauma in students, 2 families, and staff and responds by fully integrating knowledge 3 of trauma into policies, professional learning, procedures, and practices for the purposes of recognizing the presence and onset 4 5 of trauma, resisting the reoccurrence of trauma and promoting 6 resiliency tailored to a school entity's culture, climate, 7 demographics, and the community as a whole. 8 SECTION 2. 15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on December 31,16 2059.
