

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A HAWAII SENIOR BENEFITS PAYMENT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 349, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . HAWAII SENIOR BENEFITS PAYMENT PROGRAM
- 5 §349- Hawaii senior benefits payment program;
- 6 established. (a) There is established within the executive
- 7 office on aging for administrative purposes the Hawaii senior
- 8 benefits payment program to provide cash benefits for living
- 9 expenses to senior citizens in the State, as far as practicable
- 10 pursuant to appropriations provided by law.
- 11 (b) If the executive office on aging determines that there
- 12 are insufficient appropriated funds to meet the demands of the
- 13 program during any fiscal year, the executive office on aging
- 14 may reduce or eliminate the cash benefit available to any
- 15 recipient of the program.

1	§3 4 9	- Cash assistance benefit. (a) To be eligible for
2	a cash as	sistance benefit under the Hawaii senior benefits
3	payment p	rogram, an individual shall:
4	(1)	Be sixty-five years of age or older;
5	(2)	Be a resident of the State;
6	(3)	Be a citizen of the United States or a qualified
7		alien;
8	(4)	Have a household income that does not exceed one
9		hundred seventy-five per cent of the annual federal
10		poverty line for the State, as established by the
11		Secretary of Health and Human Services under the
12		Community Service Block Grant Act, 42 U.S.C. section
13		9902; and
14	(5)	Complete an application in a format prescribed by the
15		executive office on aging;
16	provided t	that any otherwise qualified individual who resides in
17	a prison,	jail, nursing home, or institution for mental health,
18	whether pu	ublic or private, shall not be qualified for any
19	benefit ur	nder this part.
20	(b)	An eligible individual shall receive a monthly cash
21	assistance	e payment beginning on August 1, 2020, as follows:

1	(1)	\$ if the individual's household income does not
2		exceed seventy-five per cent of the federal poverty
3		line for Hawaii;
4	(2)	\$ if the individual's household income does not
5		exceed one hundred per cent but is above seventy-five
6		per cent of the federal poverty line for Hawaii; or
7	(3)	\$ if the individual's household income does not
8		exceed one hundred seventy-five per cent but is above
9		one hundred per cent of the federal poverty line for
10		Hawaii.
11	(c)	Cash assistance provided pursuant to this section is
12	subject to	o appropriation.
13	(d)	For purposes of this section:
14	(1)	"Resident" means a person for whom Hawaii is both
15		domicile and place of physical residence; and
16	(2)	"Qualified alien" means a lawfully admitted permanent
17		resident under the United States Immigration and
18		Nationality Act.
19	§3 4 9	Continuation of benefits; absence from the State.
20	An eligib	le individual who leaves the State for more than thirty
21	consecutiv	ve calendar days may not receive a cash benefit

- 1 pursuant to this part during that absence, unless the
- 2 individual's absence is temporary and is for one of the
- 3 following reasons:
- 4 (1) To receive medical treatment for the eligible
- 5 individual;
- 6 (2) To accompany the eligible individual's family member
- 7 who is receiving medical treatment outside the State;
- 8 or
- 9 (3) For vacation or business travel outside the State, or
- for any other absence totaling less than thirty
- 11 consecutive calendar days, unless the eliqible
- individual has applied for and received a time
- extension from the executive office on aging.
- 14 §349- Recovery of improper assistance or benefits. An
- 15 individual is liable to the executive office on aging for the
- 16 value of assistance or benefits improperly paid to the
- 17 individual under this part if the improper payment was based on
- 18 inaccurate or incomplete information provided by the individual.
- 19 In any civil action brought by the State to recover from the
- 20 individual the value of assistance or benefits improperly paid
- 21 under this part, the State may recover from the individual the

- 1 costs of investigation and prosecution of the civil action,
- 2 including attorney fees."
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 6 the Hawaii senior benefits payment program.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the executive
- 8 office on aging for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
