A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that gorse (*Ulex* 2 europaeus), which is native to western Europe and was introduced 3 to Hawaii as a food plant for sheep and as a "living fence", has 4 become an invasive species due to its aggressive seed dispersal. 5 Gorse has proven very difficult to eradicate and detrimental in 6 native habitats; thus far, it is known to exist on the islands 7 of Hawaii, Maui, Oahu, Kauai, and Molokai. 8 The legislature further finds that the Aina Mauna legacy 9 program, unanimously approved by the Hawaiian homes commission,
- 10 is the department of Hawaiian home lands' guiding framework for
- 11 well-coordinated management for long-term protection and
- 12 perpetuation of the Aina Mauna ecosystem in the Humuulu-Piihonua
- 13 area located on the northeast slopes of Mauna Kea. Its mission
- 14 is to protect approximately fifty-six thousand acres of native
- Hawaiian forest that is ecologically, culturally, and 15
- 16 economically self-sustaining for the Hawaiian home lands trust,
- 17 its beneficiaries, and the community.



- 1 The legislature further finds that a significant need
- 2 exists for greater economic opportunities for native Hawaiians,
- 3 some of which could be provided through the collection and
- 4 product development of gorse from Mauna Kea.
- 5 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish a pilot
- 6 program within the Aina Mauna legacy program of the department
- 7 of Hawaiian home lands to remove and harvest gorse from Mauna
- 8 Kea and develop it as a marketable product to expand economic
- 9 opportunities for native Hawaiians.
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a pilot program
- 11 within the Aina Mauna legacy program of the department of
- 12 Hawaiian home lands to remove and harvest gorse from Mauna Kea
- 13 and develop it as a marketable product to expand economic
- 14 opportunities for native Hawaiians.
- (b) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 16 the regular sessions of 2022, 2023, and 2024, the department of
- 17 Hawaiian home lands shall submit to the legislature a report
- 18 regarding the pilot program.
- 19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for

- 1 the establishment of a pilot program within the Aina Mauna
- 2 legacy program of the department of Hawaiian home lands to
- 3 remove and harvest gorse from Mauna Kea and develop it as a
- 4 marketable product to expand economic opportunities for native
- 5 Hawaiians.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 Hawaiian home lands for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
- 9 shall be repealed on June 30, 2024.
