A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that not only is climate
- 2 change real, but it is the overriding challenge of the twenty-
- 3 first century and one of the priority issues of the State.
- 4 Climate change poses immediate and long-term threats to the
- 5 State's economy, sustainability, security, and way of life.
- 6 The legislature recognized in Act 8, Special Session Laws
- 7 of Hawaii 2005, that "many quality-of-life issues, including
- 8 water quality, air quality, land use, energy, and ocean
- 9 resources, are important to the people of Hawaii and should be
- 10 the focus for planning Hawaii's future" and created the Hawaii
- 11 2050 sustainability task force and the Hawaii 2050
- 12 sustainability plan to "coordinate the actions needed to sustain
- 13 a growing and vibrant economy, while maintaining a high quality
- 14 of life for all residents and visitors."
- 15 The legislature recognized in Act 181, Session Laws of
- 16 Hawaii 2011, that "[t]he creation of the Hawaii 2050
- 17 sustainability plan comes as the State faces a growing number of

- 1 pressing issues, including the steady deterioration of public
- 2 infrastructure, the lack of affordable housing, a continued
- 3 reliance on a service-based economy, the vulnerability of Hawaii
- 4 in a volatile global energy market, possible interruptions in
- 5 travel and to critical food supplies, threats to fragile island
- 6 ecosystems, ever-increasing numbers of residents, and an
- 7 increasing number of visitors over the long-term." These issues
- 8 all raise questions about the long-term limits of growth in the
- 9 State and highlight the need to begin planning and acting to
- 10 assure Hawaii's sustainable future.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish a stronger policy
- 12 framework for Hawaii's sustainability efforts, by incorporating
- 13 sustainability coordination and planning into the duties and
- 14 responsibilities of the office of planning by establishing a
- 15 statewide sustainability division within the office of planning
- 16 to ensure long-term planning, coordination, and implementation
- 17 of Hawaii's sustainability goals and policies. This statewide
- 18 sustainability division will serve as an independent, permanent,
- 19 multi-sectoral, and interdepartmental coordinating entity for
- 20 Hawaii's government agencies to work on cross-agency resiliency,

- 1 sustainability, and climate action planning issues and
- 2 strategies for Hawaii's future.
- 3 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 4 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 "CHAPTER
- 7 SUSTAINABILITY
- 8 § -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to promote
- 9 and organize the State's sustainability goals, policies, and
- 10 guidelines through a statewide sustainability planning and
- 11 coordination division to protect the State's economy,
- 12 environment, and way of life.
- 13 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
- 14 "Division" means the statewide sustainability division
- 15 established pursuant to section -4.
- 16 "Sustainability" means using, developing, and protecting
- 17 resources in a manner that enables people to meet current needs
- 18 and adapt and become resilient to Hawaii's changing climate and
- 19 ensures that future generations can also meet future needs, from
- 20 the joint perspective of environmental, economic, and socially
- 21 equitable objectives.

3		communities;
4	(E)	Encourage state operations and purchases to help
5		maintain vital and active urban communities,
6		including downtown areas;
7	(F)	Promote state purchases to support opportunities
8		for economically distressed communities and
9		historically underemployed individuals;
10	(G)	Support state operations to reflect partnerships
11		with communities and businesses;
12	(H)	Advocate for state operations to help reduce
13		adverse effects on native habitats and species
14		and help restore ecological processes;
15	(I)	Improve state operations using methods that
16		significantly increase the efficient use of
17		energy, water, food security, and other
18		resources;
19	(J)	Encourage state operations and purchases to
20		reflect the efficient use and reuse of resources

1			and reduction of contaminants released into the
2			environment; and
3		(K)	Coordinate and promote the United Nations
4			sustainable development goals;
5	(2)	The	division shall assist state agencies to support
6		sust	ainable communities, and assist and encourage

9			economic opportunities for all residents;

15		(E)	Urban communities, including downtown areas, that
16			are active and vital;

11	SECTION 3. Section 225M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

14	establish an office of planning to assist the governor and the		
15	director of business, economic development, and tourism in		
16	maintaining an overall framework to guide the development of the		
17	State thr	ough a continuous process of comprehensive, long-range,	
18	and strat	egic planning to meet the physical, economic, and	
19	social ne	eds of Hawaii's people, and provide for the wise use of	
20	Hawaii's	resources in a coordinated, efficient, and economical	
21	manner, i	ncluding the conservation of those natural,

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The establishment of an office of planning in the

department of business, economic development, and tourism, for

administrative purposes, is intended to:

- 7 (1) Fix responsibility and accountability to successfully
 8 carry out statewide planning programs, pólicies, and
 9 priorities;
- 10 (2) Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the 11 operations of the executive branch;
 - (3) Ensure comprehensive planning and coordination to enhance the quality of life of the people of Hawaii [-]; and
- (4) Coordinate the implementation of sustainability

 16 principles and policies that increase economic

 17 development while developing and protecting resources

 18 in a manner that enables individuals to meet their

 19 current needs and ensure that future generations can

 20 also meet their needs, from the joint perspective of

 21 environmental, economic, and community objectives,

1	through collaboration and cooperation between the
2	public and private sectors."
3	SECTION 4. Section 226-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending the definition of "sustainability" to read
5	as follows:
6	""Sustainability" [means achieving the following:
7	(1) Respect of the culture, character, beauty, and history
8	of the State's island communities;
9	(2) Striking a balance between economic, social,
10	community, and environmental priorities; and
11	(3) Meeting the needs of the present without compromising
12	the ability of future generations to meet their own
13	needs.] shall have the same meaning as in section
14	<u>-2.</u> "
15	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
17	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
18	the establishment and implementation of the statewide
19	sustainability division.
20	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
21	planning for the purposes of this Act.

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1	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
4	the establishment of:
5	(1) One full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) secretary III
6	position;
7	(2) Two full-time equivalent (2.00 FTE) planner IV
8	positions; and
9	(3) Two full-time equivalent (2.00 FTE) planner V
10	positions,
11	to support the statewide sustainability division.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
13	planning for the purposes of this Act.
14	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
