H.B. NO. 2045

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a gap exists between
 the skills that students have upon graduation and the skills
 that employers are seeking. Business leaders in Hawaii's
 expanding industries report that it is often difficult to
 recruit local applicants who have the skills and experience that
 local employers need.

7 The legislature also finds that educational programs 8 specializing in career readiness and technical expertise can be 9 effective in preparing students in Hawaii to enter the job 10 market in the State. Educational initiatives at schools within 11 the State have been established to develop students' technical 12 skills and prepare them to enter the workforce.

13 The legislature further finds that the need for these 14 educational initiatives is particularly significant for the 15 development of the State's health care workforce. Currently, 16 Hawaii has a high need for health care workers across provider 17 settings, including significant need in acute care, or hospital,

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settings, as well as in skilled nursing facilities, assisted
 living facilities, hospices, home health agencies, and health
 system clinics.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to expand the
number of students receiving career and technical skills
education by allowing students to enroll in career and technical
programs relating to health care workforce development outside
of the service area in which they reside.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart C, to be
11 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

12 "§302A- Career and technical education programs;

13 <u>enrollment.</u> (a) A school that has a career and technical
14 <u>education program relating to health care workforce development</u>
15 shall review all geographic exception applications submitted

16 pursuant to section 302A-1143 and make a determination whether 17 to:

18 (1) Enroll any student that resides within the service 19 area of the school pursuant to section 302A-1143; 20 (2) Enroll all students from outside the school's service 21 area who submit an application, unless the number of



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1		students who submit an application exceeds the
2		capacity of a program, class, grade level, or
3		building;
4	(3)	Use a lottery system to select students described in
5		paragraph (2) who have submitted a timely application,
6		if the school finds that capacity is insufficient to
7		enroll all students; and
8	(4)	Give an enrollment preference to students enrolled in
9		the school during the previous school year.
10	(b)	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
11	91 necess	ary to implement this section.
12	(c)	As used in this section, "career and technical
13	education	program" means a program operated by a school that
14	primarily	focuses on student learning and skills development
15	relating to health care workforce development through the	
16	practical application of academic and technical skills and	
17	knowledge."	
18	SECTION 3. Section 302A-1143, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
19	amended to read as follows:	
20	"§302A-1143 Attending school in [what] a designated	
21	service a	rea. A person of school age shall be required to
