# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the temporary
assistance for needy families (TANF) program is a time-limited
welfare program that provides cash assistance and supportive
services to needy families with children. The program is
designed to help low-income families while they work toward
self-sufficiency.

7 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii child support enforcement agency within the department of the attorney general 8 9 is responsible for collecting the debt owed to the department of human services by the non-custodial parent when TANF benefits 10 11 are paid for the benefit of any dependent child. Since TANF is a federally-funded program, federal law requires that a portion 12 of the collection be paid back to the federal government, which 13 is retained by the child support enforcement agency for federal 14 matching funds, with the remaining portion reimbursed to the 15 16 department of human services.

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The federal Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 allows a portion 1 of the debt amount to pass through to the custodial parent 2 3 without applying the required reimbursement to the federal government and the department of human services. However, the 4 child support enforcement agency's case management system is not 5 designed to disburse payment by TANF recipient family or 6 7 household. Instead, the case management system disburses child support on a per case basis, or per non-custodial parent basis. 8 9 The legislature finds that implementation of a pass through 10 program will require modifications to the child support 11 enforcement agency's statewide case management computer system 12 to consider TANF household members or recipients before passing through child support payments. 13

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to convene a study group to examine the impacts of child support moneys collected by the department of human services for the public assistance of children for pass through to the family receiving public assistance.

19 SECTION 2. The department of the attorney general and the 20 department of human services shall jointly convene a study group 21 to examine:

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1	(1)	The impacts and impediments, including any conflicts
2		with federal law, of allowing child support payments
3		to pass through to TANF recipients;
4	(2)	Whether the pass through of child support payments to
5		TANF recipients is permissible; and
6	(3)	The costs to agencies of establishing a pass through
7		program for child support payments to TANF recipients.
8	SECTION 3. The department of the attorney general and the	
9	department of human services shall submit a report of its	
10	findings and recommendations, including any proposed	
11	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior	
12	to the convening of the regular session of 2021.	
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,	
14	2059.
