# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are medicaid		
beneficiaries in the State with intellectual or developmental		
disabilities who are unable to access home- and community-based		
services. These individuals are at higher risk for future		
institutionalization because they may lack independent daily		
living skills and may be unable to manage their own care or to		
access the support necessary to maintain their independence.		
Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:		
(1) Require the department of human services, upon		
approval from the centers for medicare and medicaid		
services, to establish and implement a program for		
providing home- and community-based services to		
individuals with intellectual or developmental		
disabilities who are found, through a functional		
assessment, to be at risk of institutionalization;		
(2) Require the department of human services to seek

9	SECTION 2. This Act shall be known and may be cited as		
10	Kelii's law.		
11	SECTION 3. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
13	and to read as follows:		
14	" <u>§346-</u>	Program for at-risk individuals with	
15	intellectual	or developmental disabilities. (a) Upon approval	
16	from the centers for medicare and medicaid services, the		
17	department shall establish and implement a program for providin		
18	home- and community-based services to at-risk individuals with		
19	intellectual or developmental disabilities who do not meet		
20	medicaid's in	stitutional level of care criteria for home-and	

1	community-based services. Individuals eligible for services		
2	under thi	s program shall:	
3	(1)	Have been diagnosed with an intellectual or	
4		developmental disability;	
5	(2)	Have been found through a functional assessment to be	
6		at risk of deteriorating to the institutional level of	
7		care;	
8	(3)	Have been found ineligible to receive medicaid long	
9		term services and supports or the I/DD waiver; and	
10	(4)	Reside in his or her own home; provided that	
11		individuals who reside in a community shelter may	
12		receive at-risk services that are appropriate for	
13		their living environment as determined by ;	
14		provided further that services under this section	
15		shall not be provided to individuals already residing	
16		in a care facility, including but not limited to a	
17		care home, foster home, hospital, nursing facility, or	
18		hospice facility.	
19	(b)	Eligibility shall be assessed annually to determine	
20	whether c	ongoing at-risk services are medically necessary."

- 1 SECTION 4. No later than June 30, 2021, the department of
- 2 human services shall seek approval from the centers for medicare
- 3 and medicaid services to provide coverage for home- and
- 4 community-based services for medicaid eligible individuals with
- 5 intellectual or developmental disabilities who are at risk for
- 6 institutionalization.
- 7 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 10 the department of human services to establish and implement a
- 11 program for providing home- and community-based services to at-
- 12 risk individuals with intellectual or developmental
- 13 disabilities; provided that the sum appropriated shall be in
- 14 addition to the base budget of the department of human services.
- 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 18 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 19 begun before its effective date.
- 20 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 21 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held

- 1 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 2 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 3 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 4 of this Act are severable.
- 5 SECTION 8. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on December 31,

### Report Title:

DHS; Intellectual Disabilities; Developmental Disabilities; Home- and Community-Based Services; Medicaid; Kelii's Law; Appropriation

#### Description:

Requires DHS, upon approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, to establish and implement a program for providing home- and community-based services to at-risk individuals having intellectual or developmental disabilities who meet certain criteria. Seeks approval, no later than June 30, 2021, from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide coverage for services established under the program. Appropriates funds. Takes effect on December 31, 2059. (HD1)
