

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VIDEOCONFERENCING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The legislative reference bureau shall
2	conduct a	feasibility study that includes the costs associated
3	with the	implementation of audiovisual technology in both
4	chambers	of the legislature. The study shall examine:
5	(1)	The type of audiovisual technology available for use
6		by neighbor island residents to testify in legislative
7		proceedings;
8	(2)	The costs associated with installing, operating, and
9		maintaining equipment in legislative conference rooms;
10	(3)	The need for, and estimated cost of, additional staff
11		positions; and
12	(4)	The amount of time needed to implement an audiovisual
13		testimony program.
14	(b)	The legislative reference bureau shall submit a report
15	of its fi	ndings and recommendations, including any proposed
16	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than December 1, 2019.

1	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for
4	the purposes of this Act.
5	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the legislative
6	reference bureau for the purposes of this Act.
7	SECTION 3. The legislative reference bureau may contract
8	the services of a consultant with the funds appropriated in
9	section 2 of this Act. The contracting of services under this
10	Act shall be exempt from chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
