

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide improved
- 2 accommodations for persons with physical disabilities who
- 3 require parking at commercial places of public accommodation,
- 4 including retail malls and shopping centers, by increasing the
- 5 number of parking spaces required by title III of the Americans
- 6 with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 291-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 9 inserted and to read as follows:
- ""Commercial place of public accommodation" means a private
- 11 business of any kind where goods or retail services are
- 12 extended, offered, or otherwise made available to the general
- 13 public as customers, clients, or visitors. A commercial place
- 14 of public accommodation includes a retail mall, and shopping
- 15 center or mall.
- "Parking facility" means all or any portion of buildings,
- 17 structures, sites, complexes, including the site where the



- 1 building, property, or structure is located, that offers parking
- 2 to the public."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 291-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "[+] §291-58[+] Requirement to provide parking for persons
- 6 with disabilities; penalty. (a) Beginning July 1, 2002, any
- 7 public or private entity that provides a parking space reserved
- 8 for persons with disabilities shall comply with this part and
- 9 any administrative rules adopted under this part.
- 10 (b) Beginning January 1, 2021, a commercial place of
- 11 public accommodation shall be required to provide a minimum
- 12 number of parking spaces reserved for persons with disabilities
- 13 that is equal to six per cent of the total number of parking
- 14 spaces in each parking facility. If the number of parking
- 15 spaces required by this section results in a fraction, the
- 16 required number shall be rounded to the nearest whole number.
- 17 The parking spaces reserved for persons with disabilities shall
- 18 be otherwise in compliance with title III of the Americans with
- 19 Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and the 2010 ADA Standards
- 20 for Accessibility.



- 1 (c) A private entity, including a commercial place of
- 2 public accommodation, that fails to comply with this section
- 3 shall be fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for each
- 4 separate offense. Each day of violation shall constitute a
- 5 separate offense. Any action taken to impose or collect any
- 6 penalty provided for in this section shall be considered a civil
- 7 action."
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 10 begun before its effective date.
- 11 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 13 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 14 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 15 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 16 of this Act are severable.
- 17 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 1

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Report Title:

Retail Malls; Shopping Centers; Parking Spaces; Persons With Disabilities

Description:

Requires private businesses selling goods and services to the public, including retail malls and shopping centers, to provide a minimum of 6 per cent of its parking spaces for persons with disabilities. Imposes a penalty for failure to comply.
