## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that approximately sixty-2 one thousand children under age eighteen live in homes where 3 householders are grandparents or other relatives. Approximately 4 forty-seven thousand of these children live with grandparents, 5 according to a May 2017 fact sheet by Grandfamilies.org. 6 legislature also finds that there is a growing number of 7 grandparents raising grandchildren and who are primary caretakers of their grandchildren. While Hawaii's family leave 9 law allows employees to take family leave upon the birth of an 10
- for an employee's child, spouse or reciprocal beneficiary, or a 12 parent with a serious condition, family leave does not extend to

employee's child, an employee's adoption of a child, or to care

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care for employees' grandchildren.

The purpose of this Act is to:

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15 (1) Extend family leave in the State to include care for 16 employees' grandchildren; and

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- (2) Provide a definition of "sibling" for purposes of the
  family leave law.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 398-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 5 and to read:
- 6 ""Sibling" means an individual who is a biological,
- 7 adopted, or foster brother or sister; or a stepbrother or
- 8 stepsister of an employee."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 398-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) An employee shall be entitled to a total of four
- 12 weeks of family leave during any calendar year:
- 13 (1) Upon the birth of a child of the employee or the
- 14 adoption of a child; or
- 15 (2) To care for the employee's child, spouse, reciprocal
- beneficiary, sibling, grandchild, or parent with a
- 17 serious health condition."
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 398-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- "(c) When leave is to care for a child, spouse, reciprocal
- 21 beneficiary, sibling, grandchild, or parent who has a serious

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- 1 health condition, certification shall be issued by the health
- 2 care provider of the individual requiring care. Certification
- 3 shall be considered sufficient if it provides information as
- 4 required by the director."
- 5 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
