A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOL CONVERSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that failing cesspools
- 2 are contaminating the State's ground water, streams, and coastal
- 3 ecosystems. To address this, Act 125, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 4 2017, required the replacement of all cesspools by 2050 and
- 5 directed the department of health to develop a system to
- 6 prioritize their replacement. The department of health's
- 7 December 2017 report to the legislature identified four priority
- 8 categories: priority level one for "areas where cesspools
- 9 present a significant risk of human impacts, drinking water
- 10 impacts, or draining to sensitive waters; " priority level two
- 11 for "areas where cesspools present a potential to impact
- 12 drinking water; " priority level three for "areas where cesspools
- 13 present a potential impact on sensitive waters or coastal
- 14 ecosystems;" and priority level four, which includes cesspools
- 15 where impacts have not yet been assessed. Cesspools categorized
- 16 under levels one, two, and three include approximately forty-
- 17 three thousand cesspools in the State.

1	The legislature recognizes that the requirement to upgrade
2	or convert a cesspool imposes a financial burden on low- and
3	moderate-income families.
4	The purpose of this Act is to assist low- and moderate-
5	income property owners with converting their failing cesspools
6	to more environmentally appropriate systems by creating a pilot
7	grant project to assist with conversion costs.
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
10	designated and to read as follows:
11	"§342D- Cesspool compliance pilot grant project. (a)
12	There is established in the department the cesspool compliance
13	pilot grant project to assist property owners with upgrading or
14	converting a cesspool that the department has identified as
15	failing. Specifically, the cesspool compliance pilot grant
16	project will assist property owners in meeting the costs of:
17	(1) Upgrading or converting a failing cesspool to a seption
18	system, aerobic treatment unit system, or other
19	advanced treatment system approved by the department;
20	<u>or</u>
21	(2) Connecting a failing cesspool to a sewerage system.

1	(b)	The department shall not grant awards to any owner of
2	real prop	erty with a cesspool unless:
3	(1)	The department has assigned the cesspool to priority
4		level one, two, or three in the department's December
5		2017 report to the legislature entitled "Relating to
6		Cesspools and Prioritization for Replacement"; and
7	(2)	The owner consents to the disclosure of tax
8		information to the department for the purposes of this
9		section.
10	(c)	No grant under this section shall be awarded to a
11	property	owner of a cesspool who is:
12	(1)	A taxpayer filing a single return or a married person
13		filing separately with a federal adjusted gross income
14		of \$ or more;
15	(2)	A taxpayer filing as a head of household with a
16		federal adjusted gross income of \$ or more;
17		<u>or</u>
18	(3)	A taxpayer filing a joint return or as a surviving
19		spouse with a federal adjusted gross income of
20		\$ or more.

1	The owner's income will be verified using the tax return of
2	the most recent taxable year that is closed.
3	(d) The department shall adopt rules as necessary to carry
4	out the cesspool compliance pilot grant project; provided that
5	the rules shall include a method of calculating a sliding scale
6	grant amount based upon the federal adjusted gross income of the
7	owner of the property with a failing cesspool."
8	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to
11	implement the cesspool compliance pilot grant project; provided
12	that:
13	(1) No funds shall be released unless a fifty per cent
14	match is provided by the relevant county; and
15	(2) \$ of the appropriation may be used to:
16	(A) Fund one temporary, part-time position in the
17	department of health for a cesspool compliance
18	pilot grant project administrator to establish
19	and administer the project; or
20	(B) Contract for services to establish and administer
21	the project.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
