H.B. NO. 2167

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of cover crops and green manure increases agricultural productivity and aligns with the State's integrated sustainability goals. Plants used for this purpose, including grasses, legumes, and forbs, add nutrients to the soil, act as windbreaks, assist with water retention, provide habitats for beneficial insects, and help to prevent soil erosion.

8 The legislature further finds that it is in the interests 9 of the State to incentivize the use of management practices that 10 enhance the quality and sustainability of Hawaii's agricultural 11 lands.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish and appropriate moneys for a crop reimbursement pilot program to reimburse farming operations in the State for the costs of acquiring cover crop seeds or green manure.

16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall17 establish and implement a three-year crop reimbursement pilot



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1 program to reimburse farming operations in the State for the costs of acquiring cover crop seeds or green manure. 2 3 (b) Applications for cost reimbursements shall be 4 submitted on a form furnished by the department and shall be 5 accompanied by documentation of the costs of purchase, pursuant to subsection (c); provided that: 6 7 The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the (1)8 State and its officers, agents, and employees from all 9 claims arising out of or resulting from the cover crop 10 seeds or green manure purchased; and 11 (2) The department may request that an applicant provide 12 additional information for the purposes of verifying 13 the volume of cover crop or green manure purchased. 14 (c) Applications for reimbursement under the crop 15 reimbursement pilot program shall be filed for seeds purchased 16 within the fiscal year immediately preceding the filing and be 17 effective for costs of purchasing cover crops or green manure 18 incurred after June 30, 2020, and before July 1, 2023. The 19 documentation shall include a certification that the amount for 20 which the applicant seeks reimbursement is not already covered 21 by other governmental cover crop incentive programs, including



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the National Resource Conservation Service's environmental
 quality incentive payment program or the conservation
 stewardship program.

4 (d) Funds shall be dispersed upon approval on an annual
5 basis by the department to the farmer or rancher for up to one
6 hundred per cent of the costs incurred for cover crop seeds or
7 green manure purchased after June 30, 2020, and before July 1,
8 2023.

9 (e) The department shall aggregate the total reimbursement
10 applications pursuant to this section and divide and distribute
11 the available moneys on a first come, first served basis;
12 provided that no farming operation shall receive a total
13 reimbursement of more than \$50,000 per year.

14 (f) There is established within the department a cover 15 crop reimbursement pilot program manager position, which shall 16 be a full-time temporary position exempt from chapters 76 and 17 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The cover crop reimbursement pilot 18 program manager shall receive a salary not to exceed \$50,000 per 19 year. The cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager shall 20 possess a requisite level of knowledge and expertise in the area 21 of program management necessary to carry out the duties of the



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1 position. The cover crop pilot reimbursement program manager 2 shall:

3 (1) Facilitate the division and distribution of available
4 costs for reimbursement; and

5 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination of the cover crop
6 reimbursement pilot program.

7 (g) Any action taken by the department pursuant to this
8 section shall be exempt from the rulemaking requirements of
9 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

10 (h) The department shall submit a report of its findings 11 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 12 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 13 the regular session of 2024. The report shall include the 14 department's recommendation on whether the pilot program should 15 be extended, with or without modifications.

16 (i) As used in this section:

17 "Cover crop" and "green manure" mean the plants listed in 18 the cover crop and green manure database maintained by the 19 university of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human 20 resources.

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"Department" means the department of agriculture.



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"Farming operation" has the same meaning as defined in
section 165-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the
department of agriculture to establish, implement, and
administer a cover crop reimbursement pilot program; provided
that up to \$20,000 may be used for administrative costs.
The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
