HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THIRTIETH LEGISLATURE, 2020 STATE OF HAWAII H.B. NO. 2236

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 health is responsible for administering and maintaining the 3 comprehensive state emergency medical service system, or state 4 emergency medical system. Administration of the system by a 5 state agency ensures that all emergency services, including 6 ground and air ambulance services conducted by or under the 7 authorization of the department of health or any county, are 8 consistent with part XVIII of chapter 321, Hawaii Revised 9 Statutes.

10 As required by Act 60, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, the 11 department of health contracted with the United States National 12 Highway Traffic Safety Administration under the guidance of a 13 steering committee to conduct a study of the state emergency 14 This review was conducted on October 14 to 18, medical system. 15 2019. The United States National Highway Traffic Safety 16 Administration identified the State's emergency medical system 17 as an essential public health service for both the State's

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residents and visitors, which is a finding with which the
 legislature concurs.

3 To fulfill the duties of the emergency medical services and 4 injury prevention system branch, it is imperative that the 5 department of health strive to ensure that the state emergency 6 medical system is efficiently maintained and effectively 7 provides emergency services.

8 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:

9 (1)Require the department of health to work with the 10 National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians, or 11 other qualified entity, to conduct a comprehensive 12 statewide workforce study reviewing the entire state 13 emergency medical system to identify strengths and 14 issues and provide recommendations to increase the 15 emergency medical technician and paramedic workforce; 16 (2) Conduct a comprehensive cost analysis of the entire 17 state emergency medical system to identify strengths 18 and any issues with the system and provide 19 recommendations to improve the economic function of 20 the system, including but not limited to centralized 21 purchasing and other cost-saving measures; and

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1 (3) Appropriate funds for state emergency medical system 2 expenses to carry out this Act. 3 No later than September 30, 2020, the SECTION 2. (a) 4 department of health shall work with the National Registry of 5 Emergency Medical Technicians, or other qualified entity, to 6 conduct a study of the state emergency medical system workforce. 7 (b) The purpose of the study shall be to identify 8 strengths and any issues with the system and provide 9 recommendations to increase the emergency medical technician and 10 paramedic workforce. 11 The department of health shall submit a report of its (C) 12 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 13 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 14 to the convening of the regular session of 2021. 15 (d) The department of health shall invite a representative 16 of the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technician study 17 team to brief the members of the legislature once the written 18 report is finalized. 19 SECTION 3. (a) No later than September 30, 2020, the 20 department of health shall conduct a comprehensive cost analysis

21 of the entire state emergency medical system.

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(b) The purpose of the cost analysis shall be to identify
 strengths and any issues with the system and provide
 recommendations to improve the economic function of the system,
 including but not limited to centralized purchasing and other
 cost-saving measures.

6 (c) The department of health shall submit a report of its
7 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
8 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
9 to the convening of the regular session of 2021.

(d) The department of health shall invite a representative
from the cost analysis team to brief the members of the
legislature once the written report is finalized.

13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000 or so much 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the 16 comprehensive workforce study of the state emergency medical 17 system workforce pursuant to section 2 of this Act.

18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 19 health for the purposes of this Act.

20 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much



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thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the
 comprehensive cost analysis of the entire state emergency
 medical system pursuant to section 3 of this Act.

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of5 health for the purposes of this Act.

6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$15,776,780 or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for 9 program ID HTH 730 to meet the collective bargaining 10 requirements and recurring personnel costs for service providers 11 contracted to provided pre-hospital emergency medical services 12 necessary to maintain the current level of pre-hospital 13 emergency medical system.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 health for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,997,494 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for program ID HTH 730 to meet other current expenses.

20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of21 health for the purposes of this Act.



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SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
