A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding three new sections to part VII to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§27- Executive office on broadband development;
5	established; functions. (a) There is established an executive
6	office on broadband development in the office of the governor.
7	(b) There shall be a director of the executive office on
8	broadband development, hereinafter referred to as director. The
9	director shall be experienced in broadband development. The
10	governor shall appoint and may remove the director without
11	regard to chapter 76.
12	(c) The executive office on broadband development shall:
13	(1) Advocate for the adoption of public policies that
14	remove barriers to broadband infrastructure
15	deployment;

1	(2)	Develop broadband investment and deployment strategies
2		for unserved and underserved geographic areas in the
3		State;
4	(3)	Promote private sector, public sector, and cooperative
5		broadband solutions;
6	(4)	Support and promote local and regional broadband
7		planning;
8	<u>(5)</u>	Promote technology and service provider neutrality by
9		focusing on desired outcomes rather than specific
10		technological solutions;
11	<u>(6)</u>	Pursue and leverage federal sources of broadband
12		funding to achieve state goals related to broadband;
13	(7)	Manage and award funds allocated to the executive
14		office on broadband development for broadband
15		projects;
16	(8)	Engage with stakeholders representing various
17		interests to facilitate communication and collect
18		information necessary to support a business case for
19		broadband investments; provided that stakeholders
20		shall include:
21		(A) Elected officials;

1		(B) Government officials;
2		(C) Healthcare providers;
3		(D) Educators;
4		(E) Leaders within the business community;
5		(F) Leaders within the agricultural community; and
6		(G) Broadband service providers;
7	<u>(9)</u>	Promote digital literacy, equity, and inclusion;
8	(10)	Generate public awareness of the value of broadband
9		technologies and applications;
10	(11)	Promote adoption and utilization of broadband
11		technologies and applications;
12	(12)	Develop, maintain, and provide public access to:
13		(A) A statewide broadband map as a platform for data
14		collection to track the availability of broadband
15		services and to measure progress; and
16		(B) Other information relating to broadband;
17	(13)	Convene relevant state and federal agencies and advise
18		the governor, state agency leadership, and the State's
19		congressional delegation on actions to leverage state
20		government activities to meet state broadband goals;

4	functions.	(a) There is established the Hawaii broadband
5	advisory cou	ncil, hereinafter referred to as council, within the
6	executive of	fice on broadband development for administrative
7	purposes. I	he council shall be composed as follows:
8	<u>(1)</u> <u>Th</u>	e governor shall appoint:
9	<u>(A</u>	One member to represent the city and county of
10		Honolulu;
11	<u>(</u> B	One member to represent the county of Hawaii;
12	<u>(C</u>	One member to represent the county of Kauai;
13	<u>(E</u>	One member to represent the county of Maui;
14	<u>(E</u>	Three members to represent telecommunications
15		service providers and internet service providers
16		in the State;
17	<u>(</u> F	One member to represent native Hawaiian
18		interests;
19	<u>(G</u>	One member to represent education;
20	<u>(</u> H	One member to represent economic development;
21	(I) One member to represent public safety;

1		<u>(J)</u>	One member to represent health;
2		<u>(K)</u>	One member to represent the office of enterprise
3			technology services;
4		<u>(L)</u>	One member from the public utilities commission;
5		(M)	One member to represent the department of
6			transportation; and
7		(N)	One member to represent consumers and the public
8			at large;
9	(2)	The	speaker of the house of representatives shall
10		appo	int one nonvoting member who is a member of the
11		hous	e of representatives; and
12	(3)	The	president of the senate shall appoint one
13		nonv	voting member who is a member of the senate;
14	provided	that	each member appointed by the governor shall be a
15	voting me	mber.	The council shall select one voting member as
16	chairpers	on.	
17	(b)	Each	voting member of the council shall serve a term
18	of four y	ears,	but shall serve at the pleasure of the governor.
19	Before th	e ter	rm of a voting member expires, the governor shall
20	appoint a	succ	cessor for the voting member. Each voting member
21	shall be	eliai	ble for reappointment. If there is a vacancy for

1	any cause,	the governor shall make an appointment that becomes
2	immediatel	y effective for the unexpired term.
3	<u>(c)</u>	Each nonvoting member of the council shall serve a
4	two-year t	term and shall be eligible for reappointment.
5	(d)	The council shall meet at least once every three
6	months at	a place, day, and hour determined by the council.
7	Official a	action by the council shall require approval by a
8	majority o	of the voting members of the council. The council may
9	recommend	legislation, public policy, and solutions to address
10	the State'	s broadband needs and goals.
11	<u>(e)</u>	The council shall promote statewide access to
12	broadband	services and shall encourage:
13	(1)	Coordination between existing organizations and
14		sectors that can leverage broadband to their
15		advantage;
16	(2)	State agencies to encourage and facilitate broadband
17		deployment;
18	(3)	The development of digital inclusion and education
19		programs to encourage broadband adoption and support
20		institutions that teach digital skills necessary to
21		succeed in the workplace;

1	(4)	Efforts to provide cost-effective quality workforce
2		development training using telecommunications
3		infrastructure and facilities to access distance
4		<pre>learning opportunities;</pre>
5	(5)	Schools, education service districts, and local
6		education agencies in unserved geographic areas to
7		promote broadband access for the surrounding
8		community;
9	(6)	Public and private entities to seek opportunities for
10		partnership with educational institutions that will
11		support the use of broadband technologies through
12		community projects and public education;
13	(7)	The use of broadband communications technologies for
14		telehealth; and
15	(8)	Public and private organizations to work together in
16	•	partnership to promote the use of telecommunications
17		infrastructure and new technology.
18	<u>(f)</u>	The council shall submit to the legislature an annual
19	report de	tailing:
20	(1)	The activities of the council:

1	(2)	The affordability and accessibility of broadband
2		technology in all geographic areas of the State;
3	(3)	The extent of broadband technology use in the State in
4		the business, health care, energy management,
5		education, and government sectors; and
6	(4)	The role of broadband technology in local, state, and
7		regional economies and economic development;
8	provided	that the annual report shall be submitted no later than
9	twenty da	ys prior to the convening of each regular session of
10	the legis	lature.
11	(g)	Members of the Hawaii broadband advisory council shall
12	serve wit	hout compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses,
13	including	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
14	their dut	ies.
15	<u>§27-</u>	Hawaii broadband advisory council special fund.
16	(a) Ther	e is established a Hawaii broadband advisory council
17	special f	un into which shall be deposited the following moneys:
18	(1)	Appropriations by the legislature to the Hawaii
19		broadband advisory council special fund;
20	(2)	Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies and
21		private persons; and

1	(3) All moneys directed to the Hawaii broadband advisory
2	council special fund from any other source;
3	provided that all interest accrued by the revenues of the fund
4	shall become part of the fund.
5	(b) The executive office on broadband development may
6	expend moneys from the fund for purposes of carrying out the
7	duties of the Hawaii broadband advisory council."
8	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
11	deposit into the Hawaii broadband advisory council special fund.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the executive
13	office on broadband development for the purposes of this Act.
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
15	broadband advisory council special fund the sum of \$
16	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021
17	for purposes of carrying out the duties of the Hawaii broadband
18	advisory council.
19	The sump appropriated shall be expended by the executive
20	office or broadband development for purposes of this Act.
21	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020; and

2 shall be repealed on June 30, 2035.
