A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that projects can be 1 2 delivered in a more efficient manner by increasing the effective use of state resources. The purpose of this Act is to authorize 3 a pilot program to combine state procurement resources with the 5 public works division, under the department of accounting and general services. This pilot program will authorize the state 6 procurement administrator to hire an exempt position with 7 additional incremental funding. These changes promote 8 9 procurement efficiency, program success, and government accountability. 10
- SECTION 2. The state procurement office and the public
 works division under the department of accounting and general
 services shall develop a three-year pilot office to enable
 innovative methods of procurement. The pilot program shall be
 created, which will sit within the public works division with
 resources detailed from both partner offices. The pilot program

1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$85,000 or so much thereof as 2 may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021, for one full-time 3 equivalent (1.0 FTE) exempt position. The name of the exempt 4 position is the innovative project delivery coordinator. 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 6 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act. 7 8 SECTION 6. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect 9 on July 1, 2020. 10

DEPARTMENT: Accounting and General Services.

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

PURPOSE: To authorize a pilot initiative to combine

state procurement resources with the public works division, under the department of accounting and general services. This pilot program will authorize the state procurement administrator to hire an exempt position. These changes promote efficiency, program

success, and government accountability.

MEANS: This pilot program will authorize the state

procurement administrator to hire an exempt position to effectuate efficiency in the

area of innovative project delivery.

JUSTIFICATION: Section 2 of this bill is intended to ensure that there is access and proper guidance in

construction procurements and the way we

acquire and maintain our State's infrastructure. This is an effort to combine

procurement theoretical know-how with access to actual construction procurements both

pre- and post-award. The office of

innovative project delivery will develop policy and guidance, assist and advise on innovative best practices, and also manage approved complex innovative programs for any

department or agency involved with innovated

projects in Hawaii.

The general fund appropriation included in this measure has been proposed with consideration of the statutorily defined appropriation ceiling for the Executive Branch pursuant to section 37-92, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The total proposed appropriations from the General Fund (which include the Executive Supplemental Budget for FB 2019-2021 and Administration Proposal BUF-08(20), appropriation for bargaining

unit 13 collective bargaining increases to be submitted) exceed the appropriation ceiling by \$14,179,623 (or 0.2%) in fiscal year 2019-2020. Funding requested in this measure to create an innovative project delivery partnership between the state procurement office and the office of public works will result in the appropriation ceiling for the Executive Branch to now be exceeded in fiscal year 2019-2020 by an additional \$85,000 or 0.001 percent. This current declaration takes into account additional general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal year 2019-2020 in the Executive Supplemental Budget, administration proposal BUF-08(20), and this measure only, and does not include other general fund appropriations for fiscal year 2019-2020 that may be authorized for the Executive Branch in other legislation submitted to the Legislature during the regular session of 2020.

The total proposed appropriations from the General Fund (which include the Executive Supplemental Budget for FB 2019-2021 and Administration Proposal BUF-08(20), appropriation for bargaining unit 13 collective bargaining increases to be submitted) exceed the appropriation ceiling by \$24,761,740 (or 0.3%) in fiscal year 2021. Funding requested in this measure to create an innovative project delivery partnership between the state procurement office and the office of public works will result in the appropriation ceiling for the Executive Branch to now be exceeded in fiscal year 2020-2021 by an additional \$85,000 or 0.001 percent. This current declaration takes into account additional general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the Executive Supplemental Budget, administration proposal BUF-08(20), and this measure only, and does not include other general fund appropriations for fiscal year 2020-2021 that may be authorized for the Executive

Branch in other legislation submitted to the Legislature during the regular session of 2020.

Impact on the public: Public will start to see more consistent and uniform templates for construction procurements, as well as a new energy to partnering with contractors on high dollar, complex construction hybrid procurements that will essentially allow for the public to enjoy safe, well maintained government infrastructure that is built in a timely, compliant manner.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Departments and agencies are considering
innovative construction procurement and
project delivery processes need additional
resources and experts to assist and support
them. The department of accounting and
general services, the department of human
resources development, and the state
procurement office will provide this support
and use the knowledge and experience gained
for program improvement.
