A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MASSAGE THERAPY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 452-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§452-18 Sanitary rule. The [department of health] board
- 4 shall prescribe [such] sanitary rules as it deems necessary,
- 5 with [particular] reference to the precautions necessary to be
- 6 employed to prevent the creating and spreading of infectious and
- 7 contagious diseases."
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 452-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "§452-19 Penalties. [(a) Any person who practices
- 11 massage or maintains a massage therapy establishment, or acts in
- 12 any capacity wherein a license is required by this chapter,
- 13 without a license provided for in this chapter, shall be quilty
- 14 of a petty misdemeanor.
- 15 (b) Any owner, operator, manager, or licensee in charge
- 16 of or in control of a massage therapy establishment who
- 17 knowingly employs a person who is not licensed as a massage



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- 1 therapist or who has not received a permit as a massage
- 2 therapist apprentice as provided in this chapter, or who allows
- 3 an unlicensed person to perform, operate, or practice massage is
- 4 quilty of a misdemeanor."
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 452-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 7 "(b) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this
- 8 chapter or the rules adopted pursuant thereto shall be fined not
- 9 less than [\$100] \$250 nor more than [\$1,000] \$2,000 for each
- 10 violation."
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 13 begun before its effective date.
- 14 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Report Title:

Massage Therapy; Massage Therapy Establishments; Rulemaking Authority; Fines

Description:

Requires the Board of Massage Therapy to adopt and enforce sanitation rules for massage establishments. Repeals existing statutory language that classifies unlicensed activity as a petty misdemeanor in favor of existing statutes that treat unlicensed activity as a misdemeanor. Increases the minimum fine from \$100 to \$250 and the maximum fine from \$1,000 to \$2,000 for each violation of the massage therapy laws. (SD1)

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
