A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ELECTRONIC PRESCRIPTION ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 329-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 3 "(c) This section shall not prevent the disclosure, at the discretion of the administrator, of investigative information 4 5 to: 6 Law enforcement officers, investigative agents of (1)7 federal, state, or county law enforcement or 8 regulatory agencies, United States attorneys, county 9 prosecuting attorneys, or the attorney general; 10 provided that the administrator has reasonable grounds 11 to believe that the disclosure of any information 12 collected under this part is in furtherance of an 13 ongoing criminal or regulatory investigation or 14 prosecution; 15 (2) Registrants authorized under chapters 448, 453, [and] 463E, and 457-2.7 who are registered to administer, 16 **17** prescribe, or dispense controlled substances and their

DEPARTMENT: Public Safety

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE ELECTRONIC

PRESCRIPTION ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM.

PURPOSE: Amends section 329-104(c), Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS), to: (1) clarify that an advanced practice registered nurse and pharmacist may access information stored in the electronic prescription accountability system (EPAS); (2) allow controlled substances prescribers, dispensers, and pharmacists employed by United States Department of Veteran's Affairs facilities in Hawaii, who submit data of dispensing activity as described in section 329-101, HRS; and (3) allow authorized employees of the State of

Hawaii Department of Human Services, Med-QUEST Division, to access prescription information

stored in the EPAS.

MEANS: Amend section 329-104(c), HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: Proposed amendments to section 329-104(c) will accomplish the following:

(1) Clarify that an advanced practice registered nurse may access prescription information stored in the electronic prescription accountability system;

- (2) Clarify that a pharmacist may access information stored in the electronic prescription accountability system to review prescription information about a customer;
- (3) Allow controlled substances prescribers, dispensers, and pharmacists employed by United States Department of Veteran's affairs facilities in Hawaii, who submit data of dispensing activity as described in section 329-101, to access prescription information stored in the

electronic prescription accountability
system; and

(4) Allow authorized employees of the Department of Human Services, Med-QUEST Division to access prescription information stored in the electronic prescription accountability system.

Impact on the public: This bill is intended to aid: (1) advanced practice registered nurses and pharmacists, (2) controlled substances prescribers, dispensers, and pharmacists employed by United States Department of Veteran's Affairs facilities in Hawaii, and (3) authorized employees of the Department of Human Services, Med-QUEST Division, by allowing them to access prescription information stored in the electronic prescription accountability system.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
These proposed amendments would assist the
Department's Narcotics Enforcement Division by
clarifying who may access prescription
information stored in the electronic
prescription accountability system.
