## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACANT AND ABANDONED RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Vacant and abandoned residential properties impose significant costs on the community. Vacant and abandoned 2 homes may start out simply as eyesores but then eventually 3 become public safety hazards and magnets for criminal activity. 4 In April 2018, a fire at a large, unoccupied Maunawili home 5 on Oahu caused \$1,800,000 in damages. Neighbors reported that 6 the fire may have been sparked by trespassing hikers or homeless 7 individuals who had been illegally living on the property. 8 9 In June 2018, a fire in an abandoned Kalihi home on Oahu 10 caused \$193,800 in damages to the structure. The Honolulu fire department noted that it received reports of squatters in the 11 12 structure before the fire. 13 On January 3, 2019, fifteen companies and sixty

14 firefighters responded to a massive fire in an abandoned Makiki 15 home on Oahu. The homeowner reported that the homeowner had 16 been unsuccessful in preventing squatters from occupying the



property and that, at the time of the fire, the homeowner's 1 permit to demolish the home was under review by the county. 2 3 The costs of fires extend beyond the financial costs, as 4 demonstrated when a fire destroyed the Akebono Theater in Pahoa in the county of Hawaii. Although no foul play was suspected in 5 that January 2017 fire, the fire destroyed one of the oldest 6 theaters in Hawaii and damaged the community's social fabric. 7 8 Vacant and abandoned homes also correspond to other substantial but less obvious financial costs. In a January 2017 9 report on the true costs of abandoned properties commissioned by 10 Community Blight Solutions, a former United States Treasury 11 Department Deputy Assistant Secretary for Economic Policy noted 12 that vacant homes lead to a decline in value of surrounding 13 properties, an increase in crime in the neighborhood, and a 14 15 reduction in the tax base for local governments.

16 The legislature finds that it is in the public interest to 17 encourage the use of residential properties and reduce the 18 number of vacant and abandoned homes in the State because 19 unmaintained homes may become hazards that damage communities. 20 The purpose of this Act is to reduce the potential hazards

21 associated with vacant and abandoned residential properties by:



Expediting approvals of demolition permits for vacant 1 (1)and abandoned residential structures; and 2 Allowing the department of taxation to seek the 3 (2) 4 nonjudicial foreclosure sale of vacant and abandoned 5 residential structures with an outstanding recorded 6 state tax lien. SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 7 8 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 9 read as follows: 10 Expedited demolition permits for vacant and "§46abandoned residential structures. (a) Each county shall 11 establish an expedited procedure to approve permits for the 12 demolition of vacant and abandoned residential structures 13 located within the county. Expedited processing of a permit to 14 15 demolish vacant and abandoned residential structures shall take no more than days from the date of the permit application, 16 17 not including weekends or state holidays. Expedited processing for permits to demolish vacant and abandoned residential 18 19 structures shall commence no later than (b) Expedited processing of a permit to demolish a vacant 20 21 and abandoned residential structure shall apply only to permits

13	reconstru	ction is submitted within days of the approval of	
14	the exped	ited demolition permit; provided that the same parcel	
15	owner is listed on both permit applications. A parcel owner may		
16	appeal a denial of a permit application pursuant to this section		
17	through t	he appeals process established by the planning	
18	departmen	t in the county within which the parcel is located.	
19	(c)	The owner of a residential structure shall establish	
20	that the	residential structure to be demolished is vacant and	
21	abandoned	by providing the county planning department with sworn

5	(d)	A residential structure shall not be deemed vacant and

10	(3)	The subject of an ongoing probate action, action to

12	(4)	Damaged by natural disaster but the owner intends to		
13		repair and reoccupy; or		
14	(5)	Occupied by a mortgagor, relative, or lawful tenant.		
15	(e)	For the purposes of this section:		
16	"Par	cel" means the real property, or portion thereof, upon		
17	which a r	esidential structure is located.		
18	"Res	idential structure" means a one- or two-family		
19	unattache	d building designed or used exclusively for residential		
20	occupancy	and located on a parcel zoned for residential use.		



1	"Vacant and abandoned" means unoccupied for at least
2	days."
3	SECTION 3. Chapter 667, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
5	and to read as follows:
6	"§667- Use of power of sale foreclosure in state tax
7	lien foreclosures of vacant and abandoned residential
8	structures. (a) A state tax lien on a parcel upon which a
9	residential structure exists may be foreclosed by nonjudicial or
10	power of sale foreclosure procedures set forth in this chapter
11	by the state tax collector; provided that the state tax
12	collector has established its lien and that a residential
13	structure is vacant and abandoned as provided in section 231-
14	<u>63(b).</u>
15	(b) For the purposes of this section:
16	"Parcel" means the real property, or portion thereof, upon
17	which a residential structure is located.
18	"Residential structure" means a one- or two-family
19	unattached building designed or used exclusively for residential
20	occupancy and located on a parcel zoned for residential use.



"Vacant and abandoned" means unoccupied for at least 1 2 days." 3 SECTION 4. Section 231-63, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 4 "[+] §231-63[+] Tax liens; foreclosure without suit, 5 notice. (a) All real property on which a lien for state taxes 6 7 exists may be sold by way of foreclosure without suit by the state tax collector, and in case any lien, or any part thereof, 8 has existed thereon for three years, shall be sold by the state 9 10 tax collector at public auction to the highest bidder, for cash, to satisfy the lien, together with all interest, penalties, 11 costs, and expenses due or incurred on account of the tax, lien, 12

13 and sale, the surplus, if any, to be rendered to the person 14 thereto entitled.

(b) A state tax lien on a parcel upon which a vacant and abandoned residential structure exists may be foreclosed by nonjudicial or power of sale foreclosure procedures set forth in chapter 667 by the state tax collector at any time; provided that the state tax collector has established that the parcel and residential structure are vacant and abandoned; provided further that:



1	(1)	The department of taxation shall establish that a
2		residential structure is vacant and abandoned by
3		mailing to the residential structure's owner by
4		certified mail with return receipt a sworn statement
5		establishing that the department of taxation has
6		conducted at least separate inspections,
7		each at least days apart and at different times
8		of day, and at each inspection, no occupant was
9		present and there was no evidence of occupancy. The
10		department of taxation shall maintain a copy of the
11		statement and return receipt on file for the owner's
12		inspection and review;
13	(2)	Prima facie evidence that a residential structure is
14		not vacant and abandoned shall include but is not
15		limited to delivery of certified mail and ongoing and
16		current utility usage;
17	(3)	A residential structure shall not be deemed vacant and
18		abandoned where the structure is:
19		(A) Undergoing construction, renovation, or
20		rehabilitation that is proceeding diligently;



1	<u>(B)</u>	Used on a seasonable basis but is otherwise		
2		secure;		
3	(C)	The subject of an ongoing probate action, action		
4		to quiet title, or other ownership dispute;		
5	(D)	Damaged by natural disaster but the owner intends

8		tenant.		
9	For the purposes of this subsection:			
10	"Parcel"	means the real property, or portion thereof, upon		
11	which a reside	ntial structure is located.		
12	"Resident	ial structure" means a one- or two-family		
13	unattached bui	lding designed or used exclusively for residential		
14	occupancy and	located on a parcel zoned for residential use.		
15	"Vacant a	nd abandoned" means unoccupied for at least		
16	days.			
17	(c) The	sale shall be held at any public place proper for		
18	sales on execu	tion, after notice published at least once a week		
19	for at least f	our successive weeks immediately prior thereto in		
20	any newspaper	with a general circulation of at least sixty		
21	thousand publi	shed in the State and any newspaper of general		



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circulation published and distributed in the taxation district
 wherein the property to be sold is situated, if there is a
 newspaper published in the taxation district.

If the address of the owner is known or can be ascertained 4 by due diligence, including an abstract of title or title 5 search, the state tax collector shall send to each owner notice 6 7 of the proposed sale by registered mail, with request for return receipt. If the address of the owner is unknown, the state tax 8 collector shall send a notice to the owner at the owner's last 9 10 known address as shown on the records of the department of taxation. The notice shall be deposited in the mail at least 11 forty-five days [prior to] before the date set for the sale. 12 The notice shall also be posted for a like period in at least 13 14 three conspicuous public places within such taxation district, and if the land is improved one of the three postings shall be 15 16 on the land."

17 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the 18 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 19 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 20 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the



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invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
 of this Act are severable.

3 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5 begun before its effective date.

6 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.





#### Report Title:

Vacant and Abandoned Homes; Expedited Permits; Nonjudicial Foreclosure

### Description:

Requires counties to expedite demolition permits for vacant and abandoned residential homes. Allows the department of taxation to seek sale of the property through nonjudicial foreclosure of vacant and abandoned residential properties with outstanding recorded state tax liens at any time after establishing vacancy and abandonment. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (HD1)

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
