A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GRANTS FOR LOCAL RECYCLING FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has grappled
- 2 with solutions to deal with municipal waste for decades.
- 3 Landfill capacity is rapidly decreasing, even after creating
- 4 mitigation measures like exportation and incineration.
- 5 Currently, the vast majority of recyclable materials are
- 6 recycled outside the State. Landfill diversion has global
- 7 environmental benefits, including reducing the need to extract
- 8 raw materials from mines, such as aluminum, and decreasing the
- 9 amount of methane gas released into the atmosphere as waste
- 10 decomposes. Landfills are the third largest source of methane
- 11 emissions in the United States behind industry and agricultural
- 12 sources. According to the United States Environmental
- 13 Protection Agency, methane is the second most prevalent
- 14 greenhouse gas emitted in the United States from human
- 15 activities, which has a significant impact on climate change.
- 16 The legislature further finds that an investment in local
- 17 recycling facilities is immediately necessary to the human

- 1 impact on Hawaii's natural environment and mitigate the effects
- 2 of the climate crisis.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to incentivize the development
- 4 of new recycled products manufacturing, bioconversion, or
- 5 composting businesses within the State of Hawaii.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 8 and to read as follows:
- 9 "§342G- (a) There is established in the office a
- 10 recycled products manufacturing grant program to be administered
- 11 by the department. The department shall issue grants to
- 12 recycled products manufacturers or bioconversion or composting
- 13 businesses to assist them in offsetting the costs of operations
- 14 within the State.
- (b) Applications for the grants shall be submitted on a
- 16 form furnished by the department and shall be filed with any
- 17 accompanying documentation as may be required by the office.
- 18 (c) Grant program funds shall be disbursed from the
- 19 environmental management special fund established under section
- 20 342G-63, upon approval by the department, to the grantee for up
- 21 to \$750,000.

3	(e)	For the purposes of this section "recycled products"
4	means the	collection, separation, recovery, and sale or reuse of
5	locally s	ourced recyclables within the State that would
6	otherwise	be disposed of as municipal solid waste, and is an
7	integral	part of a manufacturing process aimed at producing a
8	marketabl	e product made of postconsumer material within the
9	State."	
10	SECT	ION 3. Section 342G-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended t	o read as follows:
12	"[+]	§342G-14[$rac{1}{4}$] Powers and duties of the office of solid
13	waste man	agement. The office shall:
14	(1)	Promote the development of coordinated statewide solid
15		waste management;
16	(2)	Identify and monitor environmental and public health
17		issues relating to solid waste management;
18	(3)	Promote source reduction, recycling, and
19		bioconversion, including home composting, through the
20		provision of a comprehensive, innovative, and
21		effective statewide public education and awareness

1		program concerning the value of source reduction and
2		recycling, and the way the public can participate in
3		these areas;
4	(4)	Comply with the federal Resource Conservation and
5		Recovery Act of 1976 (42 United States Code section
6		6901 et seq.) and any other federal law heretofore or
7		hereafter enacted affecting solid waste;
8	(5)	Seek compliance with sections 226-18, 226-52, and 226-
9		103;
10	(6)	Assess the feasibility of employing disposal fees,
11		including fees at the point of introduction or sale of
12		any product that would require eventual disposition as
13		solid waste, as possible funding sources for waste
14		management activities;
15	(7)	Coordinate with the department of land and natural
16		resources to incorporate solid waste management and
17		processing concerns in the department of land and
18		natural resources' land use planning and development
19		efforts;
20	(8)	Coordinate the bioconversion efforts of appropriate
21		agency and county activities, including the provision

1		of technical assistance and the evaluation of
2		bioconversion programs;
3	(9)	Provide waste evaluation services and assistance in
4		developing paper recycling and other materials
5		programs to both the public and private sector, where
6		feasible;
7	(10)	Promote the use of enterprise zones in each county to
8		support source reduction, recycling, and
9		bioconversion-type businesses;
10	(11)	Establish a recycled products manufacturing grant
11		program to incentivize new recycled products
12		manufacturing, bioconversion, or composting businesses
13		in the State;
14	[(11)]	(12) Create and maintain a database to assess the
15		composition of the State's waste stream. If feasible,
16		this database shall contain the information necessary
17		to generate the office's annual report;
18	[(12)]	(13) Identify and apply for appropriate federal funds
19		to support the programs and activities authorized by
20		this chapter; and

1 [(13)] (14) Cooperate with appropriate federal, state, and 2 county agencies in carrying out the office's 3 responsibilities under this chapter." 4 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for 6 7 the implementation of the recycled products manufacturing grant 8 program pursuant to this Act. 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of solid waste management for the purposes of this Act. **10** SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050. 13
