A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE TESTIMONY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public plays an 2 important role in the legislative process through the testimony
- 3 they provide. However, the opportunity to provide testimony in
- 4 person at committee hearings may not be available to all members
- 5 of the public, especially those who live outside of the urban
- ${f 6}$ core of the island of Oahu and on neighbor islands, or those who
- 7 experience barriers to access due to disabilities.
- ${f 8}$ The legislature further finds that as technology evolves,
- 9 other state governments have implemented remote committee
- 10 hearings to bridge the distance between testifiers and
- 11 legislative committees. For example, in 1978 Alaska established
- 12 a teleconference network and began holding remote hearings for
- 13 residents. The legislature notes that although the senate began
- 14 piloting a videoconferencing project in 2014, this technology is
- 15 limited to use by only a few senate committees. Telephones,
- 16 however, are available in almost all conference rooms in the
- 17 house and senate and would provide a meaningful intermediate

- 1 step to increase the public's ability to testify with respect to
- 2 legislation.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to increase the available
- 4 methods for the public to provide testimony to the legislature
- 5 by requiring committees to accept testimony remotely, by
- 6 telephone, during the committee hearing process.
- 7 SECTION 2. The legislature shall allow individuals to
- 8 provide testimony via telephone during the committee hearing
- 9 process with respect to measures scheduled for public hearing.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
