A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRITICAL ELECTRICAL INFRASTRUCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the security and
- 2 resilience of Hawaii's critical electrical infrastructure are
- 3 fundamental to the health, safety, and welfare of the State's
- 4 residents, visitors, and employees and to the national defense
- 5 of the country. The legislature acknowledges that modern
- 6 society functions because of safe, affordable, and reliable
- 7 electrical power. The legislature further finds that existing
- 8 trespass laws do not provide a proportionate level of protection
- 9 for such a key resource.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to protect the public and
- 11 electric utility employees, ensure reliable electrical service
- 12 in the State, and decrease damage to critical electrical
- 13 infrastructure caused by trespassing by establishing the offense
- 14 of criminal trespass on critical electrical infrastructure.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 708-800, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 17 and to read as follows:



1	""Critical electrical infrastructure" means any facility
2	used to support the generation, transmission, or distribution of
3	electricity, including but not limited to power plants, power
4	generation facility peakers, electric transmission facilities,
5	or electric stations or substations. "Critical electric
6	infrastructure" does not include electric transmission land or
7	rights-of-way that are not completely enclosed and maintained by
8	an electric utility."
9	SECTION 3. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
11	and to read as follows:
12	"§708- Criminal trespass on critical electrical
13	infrastructure. (1) A person commits the offense of criminal
14	trespass on critical electrical infrastructure when:
15	(a) The person intentionally enters or remains unlawfully
16	on property of a critical electrical infrastructure
17	with intent to commit therein a crime against a person
18	or against property rights, and the property is fenced
19	or enclosed in a manner designed to exclude intruders
20	with posted warning signs; or

1	<u>(b)</u>	The person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly
2		enters or remains unlawfully on property that belongs
3		to a critical electrical infrastructure company.

- 4 (2) Criminal trespass on critical electrical
- 5 infrastructure is a class C felony.
- 6 (3) Entering or remaining unlawfully on the premises of a
 7 critical electrical infrastructure shall constitute prima facie
 8 evidence of a person's intention to commit thereupon a crime
- 9 against a person or property rights."
- SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
