### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEMENTIA TRAINING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that as part of 2 addressing the present and continuing "silver tsunami" in 3 Hawaii, first responders and investigators from the department 4 of human services' adult protective services program should be 5 adequately trained to identify and interact appropriately with 6 individuals with Alzheimer's and related dementias. Because 7 individuals with Alzheimer's and related dementias may not 8 respond in a manner typically anticipated by first responders 9 and investigators from adult protective services, providing 10 dementia training designed to help identify, interact with, and 11 intervene in cases of suspected abuse or neglect of individuals 12 with Alzheimer's and related dementias will enable these 13 employees to better carry out their duties and responsibilities. 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by adding a new section to part XVIII to be 16 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
