RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the executive office

4	(1)	Oversee evaluation of the program's child outcomes,
5		teacher-student interactions, and coordination of
6		professional learning sessions;
7	(2)	Provide information, guidelines, and technical

9		assessment tools and communication platforms;
10	(3)	Collect, review, analyze, monitor, and report data for
11		the program, including student data, staff
12		qualification and stability data, and professional
13		learning support data;
14	(4)	Assist in coordination, preparation, and review of
15		policies, guidelines, and procedures related to the
16		implementation of the program; and



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1	(5)	Plan, direct, and coordinate the application process
2		for the program as well as communicate and coordinate
3		the application process with schools.
4	The	legislature further finds that the executive office on
5	early lea	rning public prekindergarten program also requires an
6	office as	sistant to provide administrative support for the
7	program.	The office assistant will be responsible for tasks
8	such as:	
9	(1)	Performing intake and tracking applications;
10	(2)	Preparing purchase orders for materials and supplies
11		required for program staff to provide support to
12		<pre>schools;</pre>
13	(3)	Preparing the necessary paperwork for travel and
14		making travel arrangements for the educational
15		specialist and early learning resource teachers;
16	(4)	Securing meeting rooms for the early learning
17		induction program and early learning academy sessions;
18		and
19	(5)	Preparing materials for the early learning induction
20		program and early learning academy sessions.

1 The legislature further finds that the educational 2 specialist for the executive office on early learning has taken 3 on many collateral responsibilities and therefore cannot 4 accomplish the specialist's primary responsibility to provide 5 the direct support schools need in order to implement the 6 executive office on early learning public prekindergarten 7 program. The department of education has traditionally served 8 the kindergarten through grade 12 population. As a result, the 9 schools have not yet developed, or are still developing, the 10 knowledge and experience needed to appropriately serve 11 prekindergarten-aged children. The educational specialist, who 12 is required to have a master's degree in early childhood 13 education, fills a large need for the schools, school 14 leadership, teachers, educational assistants, and their 15 students. To address the demands of this current workload, 16 especially with the recent expansion of the program to more 17 schools, the educational specialist requires the assistance of 18 an institutional analyst and office assistant.

19 The purpose of this Act is to support the executive office 20 on early learning public prekindergarten program by 21 appropriating funds to the executive office on early learning



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for additional operational costs for the program, including 1 personnel and associated equipment and furniture costs. 2 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 4 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 6 \$ 7 2020-2021 to the executive office on early learning for 8 additional operational costs for the executive office on early learning public prekindergarten program, which shall be 9 allocated as follows: 10 for fiscal year 2019-2020 and \$ 11 (1)Ś for fiscal year 2020-2021 for one full-time equivalent 12 (1.0 FTE) institutional analyst I position; and 13 14 (2) for fiscal year 2019-2020 and \$ for Ś fiscal year 2020-2021 for one full-time equivalent 15 (1.0 FTE) office assistant IV position. 16 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the executive office on early learning for the purposes of this Act. 18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050. 19
