A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) The Hawaii health authority was
- 2 established in 2009 as an autonomous body responsible for the
- 3 overall health planning for the State and for advising the State
- 4 on the future capacity needs of the people of Hawaii for health
- 5 providers, facilities, equipment, and support service providers.
- 6 However, the legislature finds that the authority has been
- 7 deprived of resources since late 2014 and needs to be
- 8 reinvigorated and provided with necessary funding to carry out
- 9 its duties and responsibilities. This includes developing a
- 10 comprehensive plan for all individuals in Hawaii.
- In developing a comprehensive health plan, the legislature
- 12 asks the Hawaii health authority to consider including in the
- 13 comprehensive health plan the use of the all-payer healthcare
- 14 model as adopted in the State of Maryland for Hospitals. An
- 15 all-payer health care model:
- 16 (1) Requires the same price for the same service
- regardless of the source of funding for a given



1		patient, thereby achieving substantial administrative
2		savings and eliminating a major cause of
3		discrimination against sicker, poorer patients,
4		including those covered by Medicaid;
5	(2)	Establishes a standardized, simplified fee schedule
6		for independent professionals that is negotiated
7		between the State and associations representing health
8		professionals, and applies to all payers doing
9		business in the State of Hawaii;
10	(3)	Pools hospital funding from all payers so as to pay
11		hospitals with global operating budgets, instead of
12		fee-for-service, eliminating most billing and
13		collection costs, cost-shifting due to losses from
14		uncompensated and under-compensated care, and
15		substantially reducing other hospital administrative
16		costs. Incentives for hospitals shall also be
17		eliminated, allowing for resources to be focused on
18		services that are profitable under fee-for-service, at
19		the expense of needed services that are generally not
20		profitable under fee-for-service, including emergency

1		services, psychiatric services, and geriatric care;
2		and
3	(4)	Outlines actions needed for acquiring medicare and
4		medicaid waivers from the federal government to
5		implement an all-payer health payment system.
6	(b)	The legislature further finds that the unfunded
7	liabilitie	es of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust
8	fund must	be addressed to avoid potentially millions of dollars
9	in unfunde	ed liabilities in later years and can be done so in the
10	comprehens	sive health plan. A plan and structure that best
11	address tl	he liabilities that are currently unfunded have the
12	following	features:
13	(1)	Provide health benefits to state and county employees
14		and retirees using a self-funding model in which the
15		state retains insurance risk, eliminating the need to
16		pre-fund health benefits as required when contracting
17		health benefits through fully insured health plans;
18	(2)	Cap public employer prefunding through the Hawaii
19		employer-union health benefits trust fund and other
20		post-employment benefits trust fund once the separate

T		accounts for each public-employer have a combined
2		balance of at least \$2,000,000,000;
3	(3)	Thereafter, transfer any investment income and
4		interest from the Hawaii employer-union health
5		benefits trust fund and other post-employment benefits
6		trust fund to a newly established rate stabilization
7		reserve fund, which will provide reserve funding to
8		stabilize the Hawaii employer-union health benefits
9		trust fund when the trust fund has insufficient moneys
10		to cover the costs of providing health and other
11		benefits plans for active employees and retirees and
12		their beneficiaries; and
13	(4)	Continue to provide for the use of a portion of
14		transient accommodations tax revenues to supplement
15		deficient county public employer contribution amounts
16		if necessary.
17	(c)	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to enable the
18	Hawaii he	alth authority to fulfill its duties and
19	responsib	ilities, which include developing a comprehensive

health plan for all individuals in Hawaii, by:

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
1	(1)	Directing the Hawaii health authority to submit a	
2		comprehensive health plan that includes an all-payer	
3		model and a funding source for the unfunded	
4		liabilities of the Hawaii employer-union health	
5		benefits trust fund; and	
6	(2)	Appropriating funds to the Hawaii health authority for	
7		the hiring of an executive director and other staff	
8		and expenses necessary for the authority.	
9	SECT	ION 2. Section 322H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended to read as follows:		
11	"[+]	§322H-1[+] Hawaii health authority; establishment.	
12	(a) Ther	e is established within the department of budget and	
13	finance f	or administrative purposes the Hawaii health authority.	
14	The autho	rity shall be an autonomous public body corporate and	
15	politic a	nd an instrumentality of the State.	
16	(b)	The authority shall be composed of nine members	
17	appointed by the governor as provided in section 26-34; provide		
18	that thre	e members shall be appointed from a list of nominees	
19	submitted	by the speaker of the house of representatives and	
20	three mem	bers shall be appointed from a list of nominees	
21	submitted	by the president of the senate[.—All]; provided	

- 1 further that beginning July 1, 2020, the governor shall provide
- 2 for staggered terms. Thereafter, all members shall be appointed
- 3 for terms of four years each. The majority of the members shall
- 4 be health care professionals with direct patient care
- 5 experience. All members must share a commitment to the goal of
- 6 an integrated universal health care system covering all
- 7 residents of Hawaii, and the members shall be representative of
- 8 the diversity of the citizens of the State.
- 9 (c) [One member shall be selected to be the executive
- 10 director and confirmed by a majority vote of a quorum of the
- 11 members of the Hawaii health authority.] The authority shall
- 12 hire an executive director who shall be exempt from chapter 76
- 13 and such other staff as necessary to assist in the performance
- 14 of the authority's duties and responsibilities. The staff of
- 15 the authority shall be hired without regard to chapter 76;
- 16 provided that the executive director and staff shall be eligible
- 17 to participate in state employee benefit plans.
- (d) Each member shall hold office until the member's
- 19 successor is appointed and qualified.

1 (e) Five members shall constitute a quorum, whose 2 affirmative vote shall be necessary for all valid actions by the 3 authority. 4 The authority may incur expenses as it finds necessary 5 to perform its duties and responsibilities. The authority shall 6 submit an annual report accounting for its spending to the 7 director of finance and to the legislature no later than twenty 8 days prior to the convening of each regular session." 9 SECTION 3. Section 322H-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **10** amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: 11 "(e) The authority shall submit [a comprehensive health **12** plan for all individuals in the State, including its findings 13 and recommendations, to the legislature no later than twenty 14 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2012.] an 15 updated comprehensive plan using an all-payer healthcare model 16 and resolving unfunded liabilities of the Hawaii employer-union 17 health benefits trust fund to the legislature no later than 18 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 19 2021. The authority shall additionally survey matters relating 20 to healthcare in the State of Hawaii, including findings and 21 recommendations regarding such matters, and shall submit annual

- 1 reports to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 2 the convening of each regular session."
- 3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to the
- 6 Hawaii health authority for the hiring of an executive director
- 7 and other staff expenses necessary to carry out its duties and
- 8 responsibilities.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii health
- **10** authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Hawaii Health Authority; Comprehensive Health Plan; Unfunded Liabilities; Appropriation

Description:

Directs HHA to submit to the legislature a comprehensive health plan that includes an all-payer model and a funding source for the unfunded liabilities of the employer-union health benefits trust fund. Amends the requirements for appointment to HHA. Appropriates funds to HHA for the hiring of an executive director and other staff and expenses necessary for the authority.

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
