#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that, according to the SECTION 1.

2 National Center for Education Statistics, about 3.7 million

3 students are expected to graduate high school during the 2019-

4 2020 school year. According to the Georgetown University Center

5 on Education and the Workforce, whether high school students

6 enter the workforce immediately or pursue a postsecondary

7 education, they will all eventually face a job market where an

8 estimated sixty-five per cent of positions demand postsecondary

9 credentials. States striving to increase career readiness of

10 their students can ensure that career and technical education

offerings will lead to credentials most valued in each unique

12 workforce. An industry-recognized certification conveys a

**13** student's career readiness because the credential validates the

competencies and skills required for success in a given

15 occupation or industry. According to the National Skills

16 Coalition, full-time employees with an industry certification

**17** earn more than their counterparts with only a high school

- 1 diploma, and in some cases, the salaries of non-degree
- 2 credential employees were found to be similar to workers with
- 3 college degrees.
- 4 The legislature further finds that the State has critical
- 5 shortages of qualified local workers in sectors including
- 6 health, education, air travel, and technology. Due to the needs
- 7 of the State's economy, Hawaii's public high schools should
- 8 strategically prepare students for the workforce by encouraging
- 9 industry certification in "high value" occupations, including
- 10 jobs that have a high demand for competent and skilled
- 11 employees, high potential for growth, and high wages.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to incentivize public high
- 13 school students to obtain industry certification in high value
- 14 occupations by requiring the department of education to
- 15 establish high value employment criteria for industry
- 16 certification awards to public high schools and to appropriate
- 17 funds to the department to carry out this purpose.
- 18 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 20 and to read as follows:

1	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall make the current annual list of		
2	occupations received from the department of labor and industrial			
3	relations	available to all public high schools and to the public		
4	on the department's website.			
5	(d)	Subject to the appropriation of funds by the		
6	legislature and subsection (e), the department shall pay each			
7	public high school an industry certification award calculated as			
8	follows:			
9	(1)	\$250 for each student who earns an industry-recognized		
10		certification for an occupation meeting the high value		
11		employment criteria;		
12	(2)	\$250 for each student who earns an industry-recognized		
13		certification that is recognized by any public		
14		institution of higher learning in Hawaii as a basis		
15		for academic credit in such institution; or		
16	(3)	\$100 for each student who earns an industry-recognized		
17		certification that does not meet the criteria of		
18		paragraph (1) or (2) but fulfills regional demands		
19		identified by the most recent Hawaii Statewide		
20		Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy report.		

1	<u>(e)</u>	To be eligible for a public high school to receive
2	payment o	f industry certification awards:
3	(1)	The high school shall have a recognized career and
4		technical education program with an advisory council;
5	(2)	The student's industry certification selection shall,
6		in addition to meeting the high value employment
7		criteria, reflect regional labor market data on high
8		growth industry sectors and be broad enough to allow
9		entry into those industry sectors;
10	(3)	Each industry certification selection shall be
11		nationally recognized, or shall be recognized in the
12		State as representing high quality and rigorous
13		standards in that industry; and
14	(4)	The advisory council shall review and sign the
15		industry certification proposal and selection to
16		ensure that the student is aware that the
17		certification holds value to employers based in the
18		State.
19	(f)	The public high school receiving payment of an
20	industry	certification award shall allocate one hundred per cent
21	of that a	ward to support or maintain the career and technical

1	education	al program, including the payment of stipends for
2	instructo	rs and the subsidization of fees for low-income
3	students	to obtain the industry certification.
4	(g)	The department shall prepare an annual report on the
5	progress	made under this section including:
6	(1)	The number of public high school students who are
7		seeking industry certifications for high value
8		employment;
9	(2)	The industry certifications earned by students,
10		including the number of each type of certification
11		earned; and
12	(3)	The number of public high school students who are
13		seeking or earning industry certifications and are
14		economically disadvantaged, English language learners,
15		or receiving special education services.
16	The	department shall submit its annual progress report to
17	the legis	lature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
18	of the re	gular session of 2021 and every regular session
19	thereafte	<u>r.</u> "
20	SECI	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
21	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 2 the department of education to implement the requirements set
- 3 forth in section 2 of this Act.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

#### Report Title:

Industry Certification Awards; Department of Education; Public High Schools; Appropriation

#### Description:

Establishes industry certificate awards and appropriates funds to the DOE to incentivize public high schools to encourage students to obtain industry-recognized certifications. Requires the DOE to submit an annual report containing specified information about the progress of the incentivization.
