A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that abandoned vehicles on public roads are a widespread environmental concern that 2 adversely impacts human health and safety. Existing laws allow 3 motor vehicle owners to abandon their vehicles with impunity. 4 In recent years the number of abandoned vehicles appears to have 5 increased exponentially. 6 7 The legislature further finds that the counties, who are primarily responsible for the disposition of abandoned vehicles, 8 9 are being overwhelmed by the problematic retrieval, custody, 10 storage, and disposition of abandoned vehicles. Accordingly, 11 the purpose of this Act is to: Authorize the county directors of finance to withhold 12 (1) the issuance or renewal of a certificate of 13 14 registration until the county is reimbursed for all
 - costs relating to the disposition of the abandoned vehicle;

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1	(2)	Make it a misdemeanor, with a \$250 to \$500 fine, if a
2		person abandons any vehicle on any public or private
3		roadway or any property without the consent of the
4		owner or lessee;
5	(3)	Require the court to report the conviction to the
6		county director of finance, who may proceed to
7		prohibit the person from operating a vehicle; and
8	(4)	Authorize the county to assess and collect fees,
9		fines, and penalties for actions relating to the
10		disposition of abandoned vehicles.
11	SECT	'ION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
13	and to read as follows:	
14	" <u>§</u> 28	Abandoned vehicles; withholding of certificate
15	of regist	ration; rules. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of
16	this chap	ter to the contrary, the director of finance of a
17	county may withhold the issuance or renewal of a certificate or	
18	registrat	tion for a vehicle pursuant to section 290-1(d).
19	(b)	The county director of finance may adopt rules
20	pursuant	to chapter 91 for purposes of this section."

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1	SECTION 3. Chapter 290, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§290- Abandonment of vehicle; misdemeanor; revocation
5	of driver's license; registration prohibition; fines.
6	Notwithstanding section 290-45, or any provision of law to the
7	contrary, any person who abandons any vehicle on any public or
8	private roadway or upon any property without the permission of
9	the owner or lessee of the property shall be guilty of a
10	misdemeanor and shall be fined \$250 for the first offense and
1	\$500 for each offense thereafter. The court with competent
12	jurisdiction shall report the conviction to the appropriate
13	county director of finance, who may proceed to take any and all
14	actions to prohibit the person from operating a vehicle,
15	including the revocation of the violator's driver's license for
16	a period not to exceed three months or the prohibition of the
17	registration of any other vehicle owned by the violator for a
18	period not to exceed one year, or both.
19	<u>Rules.</u> The county agency designated by the mayor
20	to carry out the functions and requirements of section 290-1 may
21	adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 for purposes of this

- 1 chapter, including the assessment and collection of fees, fines,
- 2 and penalties relating to the towing, storage, processing, and
- 3 disposal of abandoned vehicles, including those vehicles deemed
- 4 to be derelict vehicles."
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 290-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "§290-1 Disposition by counties of certain abandoned
- 8 vehicles[+]; witholding of certificate of registration. (a)
- 9 The counties shall cause vehicles that have been abandoned to be
- 10 taken into custody within ten business days of abandonment. For
- 11 the purposes of this subsection, a vehicle is "abandoned" if it
- 12 is defined to be abandoned by an ordinance of the county in
- 13 which the vehicle is located. In the absence of such an
- 14 ordinance, a vehicle is "abandoned" if it is left unattended for
- 15 a continuous period of more than twenty-four hours and it is
- 16 unlawfully parked on any public highway or road or other public
- 17 property or private lands defined as a setback, shoulder,
- 18 easement, or right of way that is adjacent to or part of a
- 19 public highway[-] or road. The mayors of the several counties
- 20 may designate an agency within their counties to carry out the
- 21 functions and requirements of this section. For the purposes of

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- 1 this subsection, "agency" means any office, department, or other
- 2 governmental unit of the county.
- 3 (b) The Hawaii public housing authority may cause vehicles
- 4 that have been abandoned on any public housing property owned,
- 5 managed, or administered by the Hawaii public housing authority
- 6 to be taken into custody and disposed of. For the purposes of
- 7 this subsection, a vehicle is "abandoned" if it is left
- 8 unattended for a continuous period of more than twenty-four
- 9 hours after a notice is conspicuously posted on the vehicle that
- 10 the vehicle is subject to disposal pursuant to this subsection.
- 11 (c) At the request of the landowner, a county may cause
- 12 vehicles to be taken into custody and disposed of that have been
- 13 abandoned on roads for which dedication to the State or county
- 14 is pending. For purposes of this subsection, a vehicle is
- 15 deemed abandoned if it is left unattended for a continuous
- 16 period of more than twenty-four hours after a notice is
- 17 conspicuously posted on the vehicle stating that the vehicle is
- 18 subject to disposal pursuant to this subsection.
- 19 (d) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, if the county
- 20 agency designated to carry out the functions and requirements of
- 21 this section determines that a vehicle has been abandoned, the

- 1 director of finance of the county where the vehicle is to be
- 2 operated may withhold the issuance of any certificate of
- 3 registration for any vehicle until the county is reimbursed for
- 4 all costs, charges, and fines relating to the disposition of the
- 5 abandoned vehicle, including for costs related to towing,
- 6 storage, processing, and disposal charges."
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Abandoned Vehicles; Withholding of Registration; Revocation of License; Penalties and Fines

Description:

Authorizes the withholding and revocation of vehicle registrations and driver's licenses for those who abandon a vehicle under specified conditions. Authorizes the assessment and collection of charges relating to abandoned and derelict vehicles. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (HD1)

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
