HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THIRTIETH LEGISLATURE, 2020 STATE OF HAWAII H.B. NO. 2565

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that responsible 2 environmental stewardship requires management and supervision of 3 the safe collection and lawful disposal of banned, outdated, or unwanted pesticides. The legislature finds that the Hawaii 4 5 pesticides law prohibits the disposal of agricultural pesticides 6 in sanitary landfills, but there are currently no options for 7 the legal disposal of these substances within the State. 8 According to the Pesticide Stewardship Alliance, more than forty 9 states have pesticide disposal programs. The legislature finds 10 that there is great urgency for the establishment of a pesticide 11 disposal program in this State so that individuals and entities 12 may legally dispose of banned, outdated, or unwanted pesticides. 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to: 14 (1)Require the department of agriculture, in consultation 15 with the department of health, to develop and 16 implement a restricted use pesticide disposal amnesty 17 program to provide a one-time, affordable, and



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1 environmentally accessible means for the disposal of 2 restricted use pesticides from a bona fide 3 agricultural entity; 4 (2) Convene a steering committee to guide and monitor the 5 restricted use pesticide disposal amnesty program; and 6 (3) Appropriate funds for purposes of the restricted use 7 pesticide disposal amnesty program. 8 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture, in 9 consultation with the department of health, shall develop and 10 implement a restricted use pesticide disposal amnesty program to provide a one-time, affordable, and environmentally accessible 11 12 means for the disposal of restricted use pesticides from a bona 13 fide agricultural entity. 14 For purposes of this Act, "bona fide agricultural entity" 15 means one or more individuals, a company, corporation, a 16 partnership, an association, or any other type of legal entity 17 in the State that engages or engaged in an agricultural 18 operation as defined in section 46-88(d), Hawaii Revised 19 Statutes; provided that bona fide agricultural entity shall 20 include any successor, heir, or beneficiary that received

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ownership of any restricted use pesticide from a bona fide
 agricultural entity.

3 (b) There shall be established on the islands of Hawaii,
4 Kauai, Lanai, Maui, Molokai, and Oahu restricted use pesticide
5 disposal locations as part of the restricted use pesticide
6 disposal amnesty program. Each site shall offer the opportunity
7 for disposal of restricted use pesticides for a duration of
8 fourteen consecutive calendar days during the restricted use
9 pesticide disposal amnesty program.

10 The department of agriculture shall operate the (C) restricted use pesticide disposal amnesty program as a free or 11 12 low-cost program to encourage the safe and legal disposal of 13 restricted use pesticides. The department shall not charge a 14 fee for disposal of restricted use pesticides that include an 15 active ingredient of restricted use pesticide weighing less than 16 fifty pounds. The department may impose a fee for disposal of a 17 restricted use pesticide that includes an active ingredient 18 weighing fifty pounds or more.

19 (d) The department of agriculture shall implement the20 restricted use pesticide disposal amnesty program no later than

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June 30, 2021, for a duration of fourteen consecutive calendar
 days.

3 (e) No later than July 31, 2020, the department of 4 agriculture shall convene a restricted use pesticide disposal 5 amnesty program steering committee to guide and monitor the restricted use pesticide amnesty program. The steering 6 7 committee shall comprise the advisory committee on pesticides 8 established pursuant to section 149A-51, Hawaii Revised 9 Statutes, a representative of the Hawaii Agriculture Research 10 Center, and representatives from any other entity deemed 11 necessary by the chairperson of the board of agriculture.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$800,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the establishment and operation of the restricted use pesticide disposal amnesty program.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of18 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
