A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that responsible		
2	environmental stewardship requires management and supervision of		
3	the safe collection and lawful disposal of banned, outdated, or		
4	unwanted pesticides. The legislature further finds that the		
5	Hawaii pesticides law prohibits the disposal of agricultural		
6	pesticides in sanitary landfills, but there are currently no		
7	options for the legal disposal of these substances within the		
8	State. According to the Pesticide Stewardship Alliance, more		
9	than forty states have pesticide disposal programs. The		
10	legislature also finds that there is great urgency for the		
11	establishment of a pesticide disposal program in this State so		
12	that individuals and entities may legally dispose of banned,		
13	outdated, or unwanted pesticides.		
14	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:		
15	(1) Require the department of agriculture, in consultation		
16	with the department of health, to develop and		

implement a pesticide disposal amnesty program to

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1		provide a one-time, affordable, and environmentally	
2		accessible means for the disposal of restricted use	
3		pesticides and non restricted use pesticides from a	
4		bona fide agricultural entity;	
5	(2)	Convene a steering committee to guide and monitor the	
6		pesticide disposal amnesty program; and	
7	(3)	Appropriate funds for purposes of the pesticide	
8		disposal amnesty program.	
9	SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture, in		
10	consultation with the department of health, shall develop and		
11	implement a pesticide disposal amnesty program to provide a one		
12	time, affordable, and environmentally accessible means for the		
13	disposal of restricted use pesticides and non restricted use		
14	pesticides from a bona fide agricultural entity.		
15	For	purposes of this Act, "bona fide agricultural entity"	
16	means one or more individuals, a company, corporation, a		
17	partnership, an association, or any other type of legal entity		
18	in the St	ate that engages or engaged in an agricultural	
19	operation	as defined in section 46-88(d), Hawaii Revised	
20	Statutes;	provided that bona fide agricultural entity shall	
21	include a	any successor, heir, or beneficiary that received	

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- 1 ownership of any restricted use pesticide or non restricted use
- 2 pesticide from a bona fide agricultural entity.
- 3 (b) There shall be established on the islands of Hawaii,
- 4 Kauai, Lanai, Maui, Molokai, and Oahu disposal locations for
- 5 restricted use pesticides and non restricted use pesticides as
- 6 part of the pesticide disposal amnesty program. Each site shall
- 7 offer the opportunity for disposal of restricted use pesticides
- 8 and non restricted use pesticides for a duration of fourteen
- 9 consecutive calendar days during the pesticide disposal amnesty
- 10 program.
- 11 (c) The department of agriculture shall operate the
- 12 pesticide disposal amnesty program as a free or low-cost program
- 13 to encourage the safe and legal disposal of restricted use
- 14 pesticides and non restricted use pesticides. The department
- 15 shall not charge a fee for disposal of restricted use pesticides
- 16 or non restricted use pesticides that include an active
- 17 ingredient of restricted use pesticide or non restricted use
- 18 pesticide weighing less than fifty pounds. The department may
- 19 impose a fee for disposal of a restricted use pesticide or non
- 20 restricted use pesticide that includes an active ingredient
- 21 weighing fifty pounds or more.

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- 1 (d) The department of agriculture shall implement the
- 2 pesticide disposal amnesty program no later than June 30, 2021,
- 3 for a duration of fourteen consecutive calendar days.
- 4 (e) No later than July 31, 2020, the department of
- 5 agriculture shall convene a pesticide disposal amnesty program
- 6 steering committee to guide and monitor the pesticide disposal
- 7 amnesty program. The steering committee shall comprise the
- 8 advisory committee on pesticides established pursuant to section
- 9 149A-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, a representative of the Hawaii
- 10 Agriculture Research Center, and representatives from any other
- 11 entity deemed necessary by the chairperson of the board of
- 12 agriculture.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 16 the establishment and operation of the pesticide disposal
- 17 amnesty program.
- 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 19 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2150.
