A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

section i. the pulpose of this Act is to authorize
counties to use fireworks license fees for costs related to
inspecting shipped containers of aerial devices at the time the
containers are opened. The costs will be funded by an increase
in fireworks license fees.
SECTION 2. Section 132D-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
"(a) The fee for the license required under section 132D-7
shall be $[\$3,000]$ \$ for importers, $[\$2,000]$ \$ for each
wholesaler's site, $[\$1,000]$ $\$$ for each storage site, and
[\$500] \$ for each retailer's site for each year or fraction
of a year in which the licensee plans to conduct business and
shall be payable to the county. The license fees shall be used
solely by each county fire department to pay for the salary of
an auditor of fireworks and articles pyrotechnic records and all
expenses incurred, including the hiring of inspectors and other

Fireworks; Inspections; Licenses; Fees; Inspections

Description:

Increases fees imposed upon importers, wholesalers, storage sites, and retailers for licenses on fireworks. Authorizes counties to use fees for costs related to inspecting shipped containers of aerial devices when they are opened.

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
