
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	1 SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii 1	Revised Statutes, is
2	2 amended by adding a new section to subp	part B of part II to be
3	3 appropriately designated and to read as	s follows:
4	4 " <u>\$304A-</u> Teacher tuition waive:	program; established.
5	5 (a) Notwithstanding section 304A-501,	there is established the
6	6 teacher tuition waiver program. The pr	ogram shall provide
7	tuition waivers for qualified students enrolled at any campus of	
8	the university of Hawaii.	
9	9 (b) A student enrolled at any car	npus of the university of
10	Hawaii system shall be eligible for a tuition waiver	
11	consideration if the student:	
12	2 (1) Qualifies for Hawaii resident	tuition;
13	3 (2) Has been awarded a grant in 1	response to the student's
14	4 submitted Free Application for	or Federal Student Aid
15	5 application and accepts all i	ederal and state aid,
16	6 grants, scholarships, and oth	ner funding sources that
17	do not require repayment;	



1	(3)	Has been awarded a Teacher Education Assistance for
2		College and Higher Education grant;
3	(4)	Signs an agreement to teach at a department of
4		education school for five years within eight years of
5		completing the program for which the Teacher Education
6		Assistance for College and Higher Education grant is
7		awarded; provided that the board may amend the time
8		period requirements of this section if compliance with
9		this paragraph and any grant requirement would cause
10		an undue burden on the tuition waiver recipient;
11	(5)	Is enrolled in a classified degree or certificate
12		program with six or more credits per semester; and
13	(6)	Maintains satisfactory academic progress, as defined
14		by federal requirements established pursuant to Title
15		IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended,
16		and determined by the campus at which the student is
17		enrolled.
18	The board of regents may require each applicant to submit	
19	documentation demonstrating satisfaction of the eligibility	
20	requirements of this subsection.	



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1	(c) Tuition waivers shall be awarded to the extent		
2	possible based on available funds and on a greatest need basis.		
3	(d) To maintain a tuition waiver under this section, a		
4	student shall maintain satisfaction of the requirements of		
5	subsection (b) on an annual basis.		
6	(e) Any tuition waiver issued pursuant to this section		
7	shall be limited to a maximum of eight semesters per student.		
8	(f) The board of regents shall adopt rules to administer		
9	the teacher tuition waiver program, including penalties for		
10	failure to comply with an agreement under subsection (b)."		
11	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much		
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the		
14	teacher tuition waiver program.		
15	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of		
16	Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.		
17	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.		
18	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
