A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM INCENTIVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that consumption of fresh SECTION 1. 2 fruits and vegetables is an integral part of a healthy diet and 3 central to the prevention of obesity and chronic disease. The 4 legislature also finds that every community should have access 5 to fresh and healthy dietary options, but the high cost of fresh 6 produce often makes that difficult. This challenge is felt 7 acutely by participants in the federal Supplemental Nutrition 8 Assistance Program, a low-income population that struggles to 9 afford healthy food.

10 The legislature further finds that through the national 11 Double Up Food Bucks Program, Hawaii has the opportunity to 12 expand access to healthy foods for low-income residents who are 13 eligible for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits. 14 Currently implemented in more than twenty states, the Double Up 15 Food Bucks Program provides matching federal grant moneys to 16 state programs that incentivize the use of Supplemental



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1 Nutrition Assistance Program benefits for the purchase of fresh 2 produce. Provided by both the United States Department of 3 Agriculture National Institute of Food and the United States 4 Department of Agriculture's Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive 5 Grants Program, these federal matching funds increase access to 6 healthy dietary options while also invigorating local economies 7 and addressing food insecurity. 8 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 9 agriculture to develop and administer a local healthy food 10 incentive program promoting the purchase of Hawaii-grown fruits 11 and vegetables by beneficiaries of the Supplemental Nutrition 12 Assistance Program. SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately 15 designated and to read as follows: 16 "§141-Hawaii healthy food incentive program; rules. 17 (a) There is established a local healthy food incentive program 18 for beneficiaries of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 19 Program, to be developed and administered by the department of 20 agriculture.



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1	(b) Participants in the local healthy food incentive
2	program who are beneficiaries of the Supplemental Nutrition
3	Assistance Program shall receive a dollar-for-dollar match of up
4	to \$20 per visit, per day, to be used exclusively for the
5	purchase of Hawaii-grown fresh fruits and vegetables at a
6	farmers' market, farm stand, mobile market, community-supported
7	agriculture site, grocery store, or other direct food retailer
8	that participates in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
9	Program.
10	(c) The department of agriculture may consult and
11	cooperate with private organizations to develop and implement
12	rules to administer the local healthy food incentive program.
13	(d) For the purposes of this section, "farmers' market"
14	shall have the same meaning as in section 205-2(d)(15)(D)."
15	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
17	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
18	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
19	2020-2021 for administration of the local healthy food incentive
20	program and to provide matching funds to beneficiaries who
21	participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.



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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
3	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
4	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 31, 2150.
