A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to the
2	National Conference of State Legislatures' No Time to Lose
3	report, the United States' public schools are falling
4	dangerously behind the rest of the world when looking at a
5	number of international comparisons, such as the Program of
6	International Student Assessment. This renowned study and
7	others like it find that if the United States, as a nation,
8	continues on this path, the United States will struggle to
9	compete in the global economy, both individually as citizens and
10	collectively as a nation. Although Hawaii's National Assessment
11	of Educational Progress (NAEP) scores have risen continuously,
12	the department of education still has much to do to be
13	considered amongst the highest performing public-school systems
14	in the United States. NAEP does not test all relevant skills
15	needed to succeed; however, it is one of the best direct

comparisons amongst states to compare the effectiveness of

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- 1 public school systems in preparing their students to be
- 2 internationally competitive.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a no time to lose
- 4 commission to examine how the State's public schools can be
- 5 internationally competitive, and appropriate funds to establish
- 6 the commission.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 9 and to read as follows:
- 10 "§302A- No time to lose commission; established. There
- 11 is established a no time to lose commission to examine how the
- 12 State's public schools can be internationally competitive by
- 13 examining common elements found in high performing education
- 14 systems. The commission shall examine how the State can
- 15 accomplish various educational goals that include, but are not
- 16 limited to the following:
- 17 (1) Ensuring that every three- and four-year-old has
- 18 access to quality early-learning education;
- 19 (2) Ensuring that the State's educational curricula are
- internationally benchmarked;

1	(3)	Guaranteeing that each high school has a career and
2		technical education curriculum that includes computer
3		science studies; and
4	(4)	Continuing to allocate funds based on a student's
5		needs.
6	(b)	Based upon effective operation practices of high
7	performin	g public school systems, the commission shall consider
8	the follo	wing:
9	(1)	Individual teacher preparation time within their
10		regular scheduled hours to allow teachers to
11		adequately prepare for instruction the following day;
12	(2)	Collaborative teacher preparation time within their
13		regular scheduled hours to allow opportunities for
14		similar-grade teachers to facilitate conversation
15		regarding effective pedagogy and the creation of high
16		quality lesson plans;
17	(3)	Time for teachers within their regular scheduled hours
18		to work with students who have not mastered any
19		lessons;

1	(4)	Higher compensation given to all teachers to produce
2		competitive pay that drastically affects high quality
3		teacher recruitment and retention;
4	(5)	Principals and vice principals conducting non-punitive
5		classroom observations; provided that the intent of
6		the observations is to offer tools to increase
7		professional growth and further develop effective
8		teaching.
9	(c)	The commission shall be exempt from section 26-34 and
10	shall inc	lude but not be limited to the following members:
11	(1)	A member of the house of representatives, to be
12		appointed by the speaker of the house of
13		representatives;
14	(2)	A member of the senate, to be selected by the
15		<pre>president of the senate;</pre>
16	(3)	The superintendent, or the superintendent's designee;
17	(4)	A representative of the Hawaii Executive Conference,
18		to be selected by its executive director;
19	(5)	The chairperson of the early learning board, or the
20		chairperson's designee;

1	<u>(6)</u>	The chairperson of the state public charter school
2		commission, or the chairperson's designee;
3	(7)	The dean of the University of Hawaii at Manoa college
4		of education, or the dean's designee;
5	(8)	The president of the Hawaii State Parent Teacher
6		Student Association, or the president's designee;
7	(9)	A representative of the Hawaii Community Foundation,
8		to be selected by its chief executive officer and
9		<pre>president;</pre>
10	(10)	A representative of the Hawaii Institute for Public
1		Affairs, to be selected by its president and chief
12		executive officer;
13	(11)	A representative from bargaining unit (5), the Hawaii
14		State Teachers Association;
15	(12)	A representative from the Hawaii Government Employees
16		Association, who shall be invited to be a member of
17		the commission by the president of the senate; and
18	(13)	Other members as the commission deems necessary.
19	The gover	nor, president of the senate, and speaker of the house
20	of repres	entatives shall appoint a chairperson of the
21	commissio	on .

1 (d) The commission shall be exempt from part I of chapter 2 92; provided that the department shall make available to the 3 public the minutes of all meetings of the commission on the 4 department's website. 5 (e) No member of the commission shall be made subject to 6 the financial disclosure requirements of sections 84-13 and 84-7 17 solely because of that member's participation as a member of 8 the commission. 9 (f) The department shall be responsible for the 10 administrative responsibilities of the commission, including but 11 not limited to the posting of public notices, preparing agendas 12 and minutes, organizing meetings, and reporting on the outcome 13 and recommendations of the commission. 14 The commission shall submit a report of its findings (g) 15 to the legislature, the chairperson of the board, and all 16 complex area superintendents no later than twenty days prior to **17** the convening of the regular session of 2021; provided that 18 beginning with the regular session of 2022, and each regular 19 session thereafter, the commission shall report any additional 20 findings and progress toward the state public school system 21 becoming internationally competitive.

- 1 (h) Upon the request of the board, the commission shall
- 2 create a master plan of its findings and how to implement the
- 3 master plan or parts of it, which shall be recommended to the
- 4 board."
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
- 8 the no time to lose commission established pursuant to this Act.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
