H.B. NO. 2123

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's tropical
 flower industry forms an important part of both the agricultural
 sector of the economy and the wider economy as well. Residents
 and businesses in the State rely on local tropical flowers and
 foliage grown by local farmers to beautify their homes,
 businesses, restaurants, and hotels. Local flowers are also
 often given as gifts to our loved ones.

8 However, the legislature also finds that there is concern 9 within the State's agricultural community that certain diseases 10 that affect tropical flowers and foliage grown in the State have caused a decline in this industry. When the local supply of 11 12 tropical flowers and foliage cannot meet local needs, tropical flowers and foliage must be imported from foreign countries, 13 14 which in turn carries an elevated risk of inadvertently 15 introducing other dangerous insects and diseases to the State's 16 farms and plant nurseries. For example, in 2014, a new fungal 17 pathogen known as rapid ohia death was identified on Hawaii



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Island. This deadly disease has decimated our native forests.
 The legislature further finds that there are other plant
 diseases and insects even more lethal and faster spreading than
 rapid ohia death that could potentially be introduced into the
 State, such as rust fungal disease. It is critical to prevent
 the introduction of these insects and diseases into the State to
 protect our critical agriculture industry.

8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to minimize of the 9 risk of disease introduction in the State by requiring the 10 department of agriculture to collaborate with agricultural 11 growers and researchers to develop and implement a program to 12 safely distribute disease- and insect-free tropical plant 13 materials to Hawaii farmers.

SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

17 "<u>\$141-</u> Tropical flower and foliage; plant material
18 distribution program; established. (a) The department of
19 agriculture shall develop and implement a program that:
20 (1) Obtains tropical plant materials from sources within

the State and outside of the State;

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1	(2)	Diagnostically screens the tropical plant materials to
2		ensure the materials are free of harmful insects and
3		diseases;
4	(3)	Propagates these disease- and insect-free tropical
5		plant materials; and
6	(4)	Distributes the plant materials to Hawaii farmers.
7	(b)	In developing the program required by this section,
8	the department of agriculture shall consult with:	
9	(1)	Tropical flower and foliage growers; and
10	(2)	Agricultural research entities.
11	(C)	The department of agriculture may adopt rules pursuant
12	to chapter 91 to effectuate the purposes of this section."	
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
15	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to develop	
16	and implement the tropical flower and foliage plant material	
17	distribution program established by section 2 of this Act.	
18	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
19	agriculture for the purposes of this Act.	
20	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.	



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1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
