A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PENSION AND RETIREMENT SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds the Peace Corps to be an
- 2 imminently important program. Created by President Kennedy in
- 3 the turbulence of the 1960's, its purpose was to advance peace
- 4 and friendship throughout the world. Today the organization
- 5 continues to plant the seeds of understanding and assistance
- 6 between peoples in a divisive world.
- 7 The legislature also finds that individuals who volunteer
- 8 for service with the Peace Corps are deserving of recognition
- 9 and credit for their time in service. They embody the lofty
- 10 ideals of compassion and altruism, which are needed as much
- 11 today as ever. Therefore, those who serve in the Peace Corps
- 12 should be given service credit in the state's pension and
- 13 retirement system, on par with what is given to those who serve
- 14 in the military.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 16 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 17 designated and to read as follows:

1	<u>"§88</u>	- Credit for Peace Corps Service. Whenever used in
2	this sect	ion "Peace Corps service" means time spent as a
3	volunteer	with the Peace Corps that has been documented through
4	a Certific	cate of Service issued by the Peace Corps.
5	<u>(a)</u>	Any employee who becomes a member of the system in
6	accordance	e with section 88-42 after July 1, 2020, and has
7	rendered s	service in the Peace Corps, may be credited with
8	membership	service credit for Peace Corps service of up to four
9	years or t	the actual number of years of peace corps service,
10	whichever	is less, as follows:
11	(1)	Any member with ten years of credited service in the
12		system may be credited with up to two years of
13		<pre>membership service credit;</pre>
14	(2)	Any member with twenty years of credited service in
15		the system may be credited with up to three years of
16		membership service credit; and
17	(3)	Any member with twenty-five years of credited service
18		in the system may be credited with up to four years of
19		membership service credit.
20	(b)	Any employee who became a member of the system in
21	accordance	with section 88-42 before June 30, 2020, and has

1	rendered	service in the Peace Corps, may be credited with
2	membershi	p service credit for Peace Corps service of up to four
3	years or	the actual number of years of Peace Corps service,
4	whichever	is less, as follows:
5	(1)	Any member with eight years of credited service in the
6		system may be credited with up to two years of
7		membership service credit;
8	(2)	Any member with twenty years of credited service in
9		the system may be credited with up to three years of
10		membership service credit; and
11	(3)	Any member with twenty-five years of credited service
12		in the system may be credited with up to four years of
13		membership service credit.
14	<u>(c)</u>	Any retiree receiving a pension or retirement
15	allowance	under this chapter, who retired prior to July 1, 2020,
16	who rende	red service in the Peace Corps and who had at least
17	eight yea	rs of credited service in the system at retirement,
18	shall be	eligible for an increase in pension or retirement
19	allowance	for each year of Peace Corps service up to four years,
20	as follow	s:

1	(1)	A retiree with eight years of credited service in the
2		system at retirement may be certified with up to two
3		years of Peace Corps service;
4	(2)	A retiree with twenty years of credited service in the
5		system at retirement may be certified with up to three
6		years of Peace Corps service; and
7	(3)	A retiree with twenty-five years of credited service
8		in the system at retirement may be certified with up
9		to four years of Peace Corps service.
10	Upon cert	ification by the system, each year of certified Peace
11	Corps ser	vice shall provide an increase of \$36 a month in the
12	retiree's	pension or retirement allowance effective July 1,
13	2020; pro	vided that the retiree claims the Peace Corps service
14	between J	uly 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021. Peace Corps service
15	certified	under this subsection shall not be considered
16	membershi	p service credit nor shall it provide for any other
17	benefits	under this chapter.
18	(d)	For the purposes of subsections (a) and (b), the
19	latest me	mbership date shall be used if there is a change in
20	membershi	p date due to termination and re-entry into the system.

1	(e) Any retiree who returns to employment, is reenrolled
2	as a member of the system, and has at least three years of
3	credited service in the system during the period of reemployment
4	may be credited with membership service credit for active Peace
5	Corps service as provided in subsection (a) or (b); provided
6	that membership service credit shall be based upon the member's
7	total service and the service was not previously certified in
8	accordance with subsection (c).
9	(g) A member's Peace Corps service shall be considered
10	service in the member's occupation at the time that service is
11	credited. A class A or class B member's Peace Corps service
12	shall be purchased at the rate specified in section 88-45 and
13	the retirement allowance provided by that service shall be
14	calculated as provided in section 88-74. A class C member's
15	Peace Corps service shall be credited at no cost upon
16	certification by the system and the retirement allowance
17	provided by that service shall be calculated as provided in
18	section 88-282. A class H member's Peace Corps service shall be
19	purchased at the rate specified in section 88-325, and the
20	retirement allowance provided by that service shall be
21	calculated as provided in section 88-332.

- 1 (h) Any violation of this section shall result in the
- 2 forfeiture of the amount of the purchase of membership service
- 3 and loss of benefits and membership service credit for Peace
- 4 Corps service. "
