#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that gun violence is a

2 significant public health and safety problem. Nationwide, there

3 are thirty thousand deaths related to gun violence annually. In

4 Hawaii gun deaths are attributable to suicide, accidents, and

5 crime.

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6 Across the nation, rates of fatal gun violence have

7 remained essentially unchanged for more than a decade, as

8 declines in homicide have been offset by increases in suicide.

9 Suicide is the leading cause of fatal injury in Hawaii, with one

person dying by suicide every two days. While suicides by

overdose or poison are fatal only two per cent of the time and

12 suicides by jumping are fatal only thirty-four per cent of the

13 time, suicides by gun are fatal ninety per cent of the time.

14 The legislature further finds that without proper training

or accountability, guns are often lost, stolen, or left by

16 owners unsecured and end up falling into the wrong hands. This

17 results in numerous accidental deaths, including children.

1 Furthermore, insufficient training or accountability results in 2 guns entering the black market and being acquired by criminals. 3 The legislature further finds quns are being increasingly 4 used in violent crimes, but current and historical data of qun 5 purchases, transfers, theft, and use in crimes has not been 6 meaningfully combined and analyzed to track these firearms or 7 determine exactly where and how guns are being trafficked. 8 Other jurisdictions have combined similar data sets to enable 9 tracking of specific firearms, providing law enforcement a 10 clearer picture of how guns end up in the hands of criminals and 11 allowing them to target black market actors accordingly. 12 The legislature further finds that too little is known 13 about qun violence and its prevention. According to a study 14 published in the Journal of the American Medical Association, between 2004 and 2015, research related to gun violence was 15 16 substantially underfunded and understudied compared with other 17 leading causes of death. In addition, medical and mental health 18 information has not been connected in a meaningful way to 19 provide a complete picture of the circumstances that pose the 20 highest risk for gun violence among those with medical or mental 21 health issues.

1	Since the federal government has largely halted research
2	relating to gun violence, both the federal and state governments
3	lack the capacity to connect and analyze law enforcement and
4	mental health data to track black market guns used in crimes,
5	identify at-risk or unstable individuals who may be armed, and
6	develop evidence-based policies that can save lives.
7	The purpose of this Act is to prevent gun violence and save
8	lives by establishing the Hawaii gun violence prevention center
9	within the University of Hawaii with a mission to bring law
10	enforcement and medical stakeholders together to analyze related
11	data and develop evidence-based strategies to prevent gun
12	violence in Hawaii.
13	SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by adding a new subpart to part IV to be appropriately
15	designated and to read as follows:
16	" Hawaii Gun Violence Prevention Center
17	§304A-A Hawaii gun violence prevention center;
18	established. (a) There is established within the University of
19	Hawaii the Hawaii gun violence prevention center. The center
20	shall be directed and managed by an administrator appointed by
21	the president of the University of Hawaii subject to chapter 76.

The Hawaii qun violence prevention center shall work 1 (b) 2 with law enforcement, the medical community, policy makers, and 3 other stakeholders to collect and analyze data, conduct 4 research, and make recommendations for prevention of gun-related 5 violence. 6 (c) The Hawaii gun violence prevention center may 7 coordinate with other institutions working on this issue. 8 The Hawaii qun violence prevention center shall work (d) 9 on a continuing basis with the State and counties to identify, **10** implement, and evaluate innovative gun violence prevention 11 policies and programs. 12 (e) To help ensure a long-term and successful effort to understand and prevent gun violence, the Hawaii gun violence 13 14 prevention center may recruit and provide specialized training 15 opportunities for staff members. 16 (f) As a supplement to its own research, the Hawaii qun violence prevention center may administer grants for research on 17 gun violence. All research funds shall be awarded on a basis of 18 19 scientific merit as determined by an open, competitive peer review process that assures objectivity, consistency, and high 20

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quality.

1	(g) The peer review process for the selection of grants
2	awarded by the Hawaii gun violence prevention center shall be
3	modeled on the process used by the National Institutes of Health
4	in its grantmaking process.
5	(h) The Hawaii gun violence prevention center shall submit
6	an annual report to the governor and legislature on its
7	research, findings, and recommendations. The report shall
8	include a financial report on the center's expenditures, grants
9	made, and pending grants.
10	(i) State agencies and entities, including but not limited
11	to the department of the attorney general, department of health,
12	department of public safety, department of defense, and
13	department of human services, shall cooperate with the
14	University of Hawaii and Hawaii gun violence prevention center
15	and shall provide to the center, upon proper request, the data
16	necessary for the center to conduct its research.
17	(j) The Hawaii gun violence prevention center and all
18	recipients of grants shall provide copies of their research
19	publications to the governor, legislature, and agencies
20	supplying data used in the conduct of that research as soon as
21	is practicable following publication.

2	fund. (a	) There is established in the state treasury a special

7	(1)	Appropriations made by the legislature for deposit
8		into the special fund;
9	(2)	Donations and contributions made by private
10		individuals or organizations;
11	(3)	Proceeds from forfeitures pursuant to chapter 712A;
12		and
13	(4)	Grants provided by governmental agencies or any other
14		source, except for funds that may not be used for the
15		purposes of the special fund pursuant to federal law.
16	<u>(b)</u>	The Hawaii gun violence prevention center special fund
17	may be us	ed by the Hawaii gun violence prevention center for one
18	or more o	f the following purposes:
19	(1)	Planning, designing, developing, implementing, and
20		reporting on gun violence prevention policies pursuant
21		to this subpart:

1	(2) Providing grants to nongovernmental organizations for
2	gun violence prevention in projects subject to this
3	subpart; and
4	(3) Administrative costs.
5	SECTION 3. Section 712A-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (4) to read as follows:
7	"(4) There is established in the department of the
8	attorney general a revolving fund to be known as the criminal
9	forfeiture fund, hereinafter referred to as the "fund" in which
10	shall be deposited one-half of the proceeds of a forfeiture and
11	any penalties paid pursuant to section 712A-10(6). All moneys
12	in the fund shall be expended by the attorney general and are
13	appropriated for the following purposes:
14	(a) The payment of any expenses necessary to seize,
15	detain, appraise, inventory, safeguard, maintain,
16	advertise, or sell property seized, detained, or
17	forfeited pursuant to this chapter or of any other
18	necessary expenses incident to the seizure, detention
19	or forfeiture of such property and such contract
20	services and payments to reimburse any federal, state

1		or county agency for any expenditures made to perform
2		the foregoing functions;
3	(b)	The payment of awards for information or assistance
4		leading to a civil or criminal proceeding;
5	(c)	The payment of supplemental sums to state and county
6		agencies for law enforcement purposes;
7	(d)	The payment of expenses arising in connection with
8		programs for training and education of law enforcement
9		officers;
10	(e)	The payment of expenses arising in connection with
11		enforcement pursuant to the drug nuisance abatement
12		unit in the department of the attorney general; and
13	(f)	The payment of expenses arising in connection with the
14		law enforcement officer independent review board in
15		the department of the attorney general $[-]$ ;
16	provided	that the attorney general may use moneys in the fund
17	for depos	it into the Hawaii gun violence prevention center
18	special f	und established pursuant to section 304A-B."
19	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be

- 1 deposited into the Hawaii gun violence prevention center special
- 2 fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii gun
- 4 violence prevention center special fund the sum of \$
- 5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021
- 6 for the establishment of three or more full-time permanent
- 7 positions to carry out the provisions of this Act.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 9 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 11 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 12 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 13 the new sections in this Act.
- 14 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 17 provided that the amendments made to section 712A-16, Hawaii
- 18 Revised Statutes, by section 3 of this Act shall not be repealed
- 19 when that section is reenacted on June 30, 2022, pursuant to
- 20 section 7 of Act 161, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016.

#### Report Title:

Gun Violence Prevention; Research; Special Fund; Appropriation

#### Description:

Establishes the Hawaii Gun Violence Prevention Center to assist law enforcement, analyze data, and conduct research necessary to help reduce gun violence. Creates a special fund to support the Center. Appropriates funds.

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
