A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that YouthBuild is a SECTION 1. 2 federal workforce development program that provides employment, education, leadership development, and training opportunities to 3 4 disadvantaged and low-income youth between the ages of sixteen and twenty-four, most of whom are secondary school dropouts and 5 6 are either a member of a low-income family, or a foster care 7 youth, youth offender, youth with a disability, child of an incarcerated parent, or migrant youth. 8

9 The United States Department of Labor administers the 10 YouthBuild program, which in 2019 awarded sixty-seven grants 11 totaling \$85,000,000 to support and expand YouthBuild programs 12 across the United States. Program participants receive education services that may lead to either a high school diploma 13 14 or general educational development. Participants also receive 15 occupational skills training and are encouraged to pursue a 16 post-secondary education or additional training, including 17 registered apprenticeship programs. The program is designed to



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1 create a skilled workforce in the construction industry, through 2 rehabilitation and construction of housing for homeless 3 individuals and families and low-income families, as well as 4 public facilities, or in other high-wage, high-demand jobs. The 5 program also benefits the larger community by providing more new 6 and rehabilitated affordable housing.

7 The purpose of this Act is to further improve workforce 8 development in Hawaii by establishing a state YouthBuild program 9 under the department of labor and industrial relations to assist 10 interested non-profit or public entities in applying and 11 qualifying for a grant under the federal YouthBuild program. 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 371, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 13 14 and to read as follows:

15 "<u>\$371-</u> YouthBuild Program; established. (a) There is
16 established the YouthBuild program, which shall be placed within
17 the department for administrative purposes. The department
18 shall assist non-profit or public entities in applying and
19 qualifying for YouthBuild program grants from the United States
20 Department of Labor.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of4 labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the department of labor and industrial relations to award grants 8 9 to eligible non-profit or public entities that have been awarded 10 a federal YouthBuild program grant; provided that any funds 11 awarded pursuant to this section shall be used to meet the 12 twenty-five per cent matching funds requirement of the United 13 States Department of Labor YouthBuild program.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.

16 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050;
provided that sections 3 and 4 shall take effect on January 1,
2050.
