

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAGNET SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a need to create more educational opportunities for children in the public 2 school system. While recognizing the reforms to the educational

system brought about by the establishment of public charter 4

5 schools, the legislature also finds that there remains room for

6 further exploration of diverse methods of innovation in the

public schools. According to a report commissioned by Magnet 7

Schools of America and conducted by the University of North 8

9 Carolina-Charlotte's Urban Institute in 2016, there are

approximately 4,340 public elementary and secondary magnet

schools serving nearly 3.5 million students in the United

12 States.

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The purpose of this Act is to authorize the department of 13

education to establish new magnet schools or convert existing 14

public schools to magnet schools. 15

1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new section to subpart C of part II to be
3	appropriat	cely designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 302	Magnet schools; establishment or conversion.
5	(a) As a	part of the public school system, the department may:
6	(1)	Establish magnet schools; or
7	(2)	Convert existing public schools, except charter
8	•	schools governed by chapter 302D, to magnet schools,
9	that provi	ide a program of instruction designed to serve student
10	population	ns with specialized interests and aptitudes.
11	(b)	The department may use a selective admission process
12	to ensure	the enrollment of students who:
13	(1)	Share a common set of specialized interests or
14		aptitudes;
15	(2)	Reside in one or more designated complex areas; and
16	(3)	Otherwise possess diverse demographic characteristics
17		in terms of socioeconomic background.
18	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
19	91 to imp	lement this section."

1	SECTION 3. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"_Magnet school" means a public elementary school or publi		
5	secondary school that offers a specialized curriculum with a		
6	common theme or focus, in which enrollment may be chosen as an		
7	alternative to enrollment in a school pursuant to section 302A-		
8	1143, and that is capable of attracting substantial numbers of		
9	students with diverse demographic backgrounds from a broad		
10	geographical area."		
11	SECTION 4. Section 302A-1143, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§302A-1143 Attending school in what service area. A		
14	person of school age shall be required to attend the school of		
15	the service area, as determined by the department, in which the		
16	person resides, unless:		
17	(1) The person is enrolled in a Hawaiian language medium		
18	education program $[0r]_{\underline{f}}$ charter school $[r]_{\underline{f}}$ or magnet		
19	school;		

1	(2)	A geographic exception to attend a school in another
2		service area is requested and granted at the
3		discretion of the department; or
4	(3)	Out-of-service-area attendance is mandated by the
5		department or by federal law."
6	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
