#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TUITION AND FEES SPECIAL FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 304A-2153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§304A-2153 University of Hawaii tuition and fees special 4 fund. (a) There is established the University of Hawaii 5 tuition and fees special fund into which shall be deposited all revenue collected by the university for regular, summer, and 6 7 continuing education credit tuition, tuition-related course and . 8 fee charges, and any other charges to students, except as **9** · provided by law. Moneys deposited into the fund shall be 10 expended to maintain or improve the university's programs and 11 operations and shall not be:

12	(1)	Used as a justification for reducing any budget
13		request or allotment to the university unless the
14		university requests such a reduction;

15 (2) Transferred unless otherwise authorized by the16 legislature; and



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(3) Restricted by the governor or the director of finance
without the prior approval of the legislature.
Any rule, policy, or action of any agency or individual in
contravention of this subsection shall be void as against public
policy.

6 (b) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of 7 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually, 8 excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of 9 promoting alumni relations and generating private donations for 10 deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation for the purposes of the university. Any expenditure authorized pursuant 11 12 to this subsection shall be for a public purpose and shall not 13 be subject to chapters 42F, 103, 103D, and 103F. The university 14 shall submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing 15 the use of any funds authorized by the board under this 16 subsection no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 17 each regular session.

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Identify each department of the University of Hawaii
Foundation supported by moneys from the fund;

16		the University of Hawaii support fund.						
17	(c)	Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the						
18	universit	y may transfer funds from the University of Hawaii						
19	tuition a	nd fees special fund into the scholarship and						
20	assistance special fund established pursuant to section 304A-							
21	2159.
