A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TUITION AND FEES SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 304A-2153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: "§304A-2153 University of Hawaii tuition and fees special 3 4 (a) There is established the University of Hawaii 5 tuition and fees special fund into which shall be deposited all 6 revenue collected by the university for regular, summer, and continuing education credit tuition, tuition-related course and 7 8 fee charges, and any other charges to students, except as 9 provided by law. Moneys deposited into the fund shall be 10 expended to maintain or improve the university's programs and 11 operations and shall not be: 12 Used as a justification for reducing any budget 13 request or allotment to the university unless the 14 university requests such a reduction;

Transferred unless otherwise authorized by the

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legislature; and

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- (3) Restricted by the governor or the director of finance
 without the prior approval of the legislature.
- Any rule, policy, or action of any agency or individual in contravention of this subsection shall be void as against public
- 5 policy.
- 6 (b) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of
- 7 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually,
- 8 excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of
- 9 promoting alumni relations and generating private donations for
- 10 deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation for the
- 11 purposes of the university. Any expenditure authorized pursuant
- 12 to this subsection shall be for a public purpose and shall not
- 13 be subject to chapters 42F, 103, 103D, and 103F. The university
- 14 shall submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing
- 15 the use of any funds authorized by the board under this
- 16 subsection no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 17 each regular session.

- (1) Identify each department of the University of Hawaii

15	(6)	Identify amounts and purposes of all expenditures from			
16		the University of Hawaii support fund.

18	universit	y may transfer funds from the University of Hawaii			
19	tuition and fees special fund into the scholarship and				
20	assistance special fund established pursuant to section 304A-
