A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EYE CARE MEDICATION COVERAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many patients
- 2 require prescription eye drops for in-home treatment of their
- 3 medical conditions. When patients self-administer these eye
- 4 medications, a certain amount of the medication typically goes
- 5 unused due to spills or other factors. Eye drops are
- 6 notoriously hard to administer, even for those with steady
- 7 hands. The inadvertent wastage of eye drops is a common problem
- 8 among patients who cannot see, are elderly, or have arthritis,
- 9 or otherwise have difficulty administering eye drops.
- 10 Patients who run out of their eye drop medications prior to
- 11 the end of a prescription period may desire early refills.
- 12 However, some insurers deny early refills because the insurers
- 13 do not take into account the wastage factor in counting the
- 14 number of drops needed for a prescription period.
- 15 At least seventeen states have enacted "drop bills",
- 16 legislation that allow patients to refill eye drop medication
- 17 prescriptions early under certain conditions. These states are:

- 1 Illinois, Iowa, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts,
- 2 Minnesota, Missouri, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New
- 3 York, Oklahoma, Oregon, Texas, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.
- 4 The legislature recognizes that self-administration of eye
- 5 drops may involve some reasonable amount of waste and that early
- 6 prescription refills may be appropriate in some circumstances.
- 7 Furthermore, access to those eye drops is particularly important
- 8 as drug developers seek to make more treatments available in eye
- 9 drop form.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit health
- 11 insurers from denying coverage for early refills of topical eye
- 12 medication prescriptions under certain conditions.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to part I of article 10A to be
- 15 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 16 "§431:10A- Topical eye medication prescription
- 17 coverage; refills. No individual policy of accident and health
- 18 or sickness insurance issued in this State that provides
- 19 coverage for prescription topical eye medication may deny
- 20 coverage for the refilling of a prescription for topical eye
- 21 medication if:

11		exceed the total number of refills prescribed."

6		least seventy-five per cent of the predicted days of

8	(3)	The original prescription indicates that refills are

10	(4)	The early refill requested by the member does not	
11		exceed the total number of refills prescribed."	
12	SECT	ION 5. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended to read as follows:		
14	"§43	2D-23 Required provisions and benefits.	
15	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each		
16	policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after		
17	January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to		
18	this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections
