A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER QUALITY MONITORING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the clean water
- 2 branch of the department of health has inadequate staff capacity
- 3 to meet its obligations to perform the timely monitoring that
- 4 ensures the island of Hawaii's stream and coastal water safety
- 5 for public swimming, fishing, and other recreation. In
- 6 particular, contaminants from waste water treatment plant
- 7 outfalls, injection wells, and cesspools need to be addressed
- 8 because of their role in harming coral reefs.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 10 department of health to establish one full-time equivalent
- 11 position (1.0 FTE) to conduct water quality assessments on all
- 12 streams and coastal waters on the island of Hawaii, investigate
- 13 complaints, and enforce surface water regulations.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

- 1 2020-2021 for the clean water branch of the department of health
- 2 to hire one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) environmental health
- 3 specialist IV employee to monitor and enforce the water quality
- 4 and safety of all Hawaii island's streams and coastal waters by:
- 5 (1) Acquiring water samples in Hawaii island streams,
- 6 coastal waters, and seeps;
- 7 (2) Conducting watershed assessments and various surface
- 8 water tests;
- 9 (3) Investigating complaints; and
- 10 (4) Enforcing surface water regulations.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 12 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
