A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ARRANGEMENT OF CANDIDATE NAMES ON BALLOTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are numerous
- 2 publicly available studies that show that the election candidate
- 3 who is listed first on a ballot has an advantage over the other
- 4 candidates listed. The legislature also finds that several
- 5 states, such as California and Ohio, arrange the candidates!
- 6 names randomly across ballots so that each possible permutation
- 7 appears an equal number of times. This allows each candidate to
- 8 be represented fairly and equally on the ballots.
- 9 Currently, on the Hawaii ballot, candidates for a specific
- 10 office are listed in alphabetical order starting with the letter
- 11 "A", and the ballots are identical across precincts for that
- 12 office.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to require the randomization of
- 14 names of candidates listed on individual ballots and on ballots
- 15 across precincts, thereby making the advantage of being the
- 16 first candidate listed on a ballot a random event.

SECTION 2. Section 11-115, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
"(a) The names of the candidates shall be placed upon the
ballot for their respective offices in [alphabetical] random
order so that the names are randomized on individual ballots and
also randomly rotated from one precinct to another except:
(1) As provided in section 11-118;
(2) [For] Subject to the limitations of the voting system
in use; and
(3) $[For]$ In the case of the candidates for vice president
and lieutenant governor in the general election
[whose], the names of those candidates shall be placed
immediately below the name of the candidate for
president or governor of the same political party."
SECTION 3. The chief election officer is directed to
establish procedures to implement the purpose of this Act, which
shall apply to the election cycle beginning on January 1, 2020.
SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
