

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMALL BOAT HARBORS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Kahoʻolawe island
2	reserve commission is in need of funds so that it may fulfill
3	its duty to protect the Kahoʻolawe island reserve. The
4	legislature also finds that the commission is attempting to
5	raise funds through the use of properties in Kihei, one of which
6	is the site of a planned museum that informs visitors about
7	Kaho'olawe island. The legislature believes that more people,
8	especially people who use the nearby Kihei small boat harbor,
9	are likely to visit these properties if the commission has
10	management control over the Kihei small boat harbor.
11	The purpose of this Act is to assist the Kahoʻolawe island
12	reserve commission in its efforts by:
13	(1) Authorizing the board of land and natural resources to
14	transfer to the Kahoʻolawe island reserve commission
15	the board's duties to operate, administer, manage, and
16	maintain the Kihei small boat harbor, except for the

1	issuance of certain permits and the collection of		
2	certain fees; and		
3	(2) Authorizing the Kahoʻolawe island reserve commission to		
4	undertake the management of the Kihei small boat		
5	harbor.		
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
8	and to read as follows:		
9	"§200- Kihei small boat harbor; transfer of duties. (a)		
10	The board may transfer to the Kahoʻolawe island reserve		
11	commission the board's duties under sections 200-2 and 200-3 to		
12	operate, administer, manage, and maintain the Kihei small boat		
13	harbor; provided that all permits issued under section 200-10		
14	shall remain under the statewide boating program; and provided		
15	further that all fees collected shall be deposited in the		
16	boating special fund.		
17	(b) If the Kahoʻolawe island reserve commission assumes		
18	duties pursuant to this section, the commission shall comply		
19	with this chapter and all other applicable laws.		
20	(c) Notwithstanding section 37-74(d), funds may be		
21	transferred between the board and the Kahoʻolawe island reserve		

- 1 commission to the extent necessary for the purposes of this
- 2 section; provided that any transfer of funds appropriated by the
- 3 legislature shall be reported to the legislature pursuant to
- 4 section 37-74(d)(1).
- 5 (d) The board shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91,
- 6 necessary for the purposes of this section."
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 6K-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "§6K-6 Responsibilities and duties of the commission. The
- 10 general administration of the island reserve shall rest with the
- 11 commission. In carrying out its duties and responsibilities,
- 12 the commission:
- 13 (1) Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for
- permissible uses within the island reserve;
- 15 (2) Shall approve all contracts for services and rules
- pertaining to the island reserve;
- 17 (3) Shall provide advice to the governor, the department,
- and other departments and agencies on any matter
- relating to the island reserve;

1	( = )	bhair provide davice to the orrice or prainting and the
2		department of the attorney general on any matter
3		relating to the federal conveyance of Kahoʻolawe;
4	(5)	May enter into curator or stewardship agreements with
5		appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual community
6		organizations for the perpetuation of native Hawaiian
7		cultural, religious, and subsistence customs, beliefs,
8		and practices for the purposes stated in section 6K-3;
9	(6)	Shall carry out those powers and duties otherwise
10		conferred upon the board of land and natural resources
11		and the land use commission with regard to
12		dispositions and approvals pertaining to the island
13		reserve. All powers and duties of the board of land
14		and natural resources and the land use commission
15		concerning dispositions and approvals pertaining to
16		the island reserve are transferred to the commission;
17	(7)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
18		island reserve otherwise conferred upon the county of
19		Maui by chapter 205A. The powers and duties of the
20		county of Maui and its agencies concerning coastal

1		zone dispositions and approvals pertaining to the
2		island reserve are transferred to the commission;
3	(8)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
4		island reserve otherwise conferred upon the island
5		burial councils and the department with regard to
6		proper treatment of burial sites and human skeletal
7		remains found in the island reserve;
8	(9)	May operate, administer, manage, and maintain the
9		Kihei small boat harbor pursuant to section 200- ;
10	[ <del>(9)</del> ]	(10) Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91
11		that are necessary for the purposes of this chapter
12		and shall maintain a record of its proceedings and
13		actions;
14	[ <del>(10)</del> ]	(11) May delegate to the executive director or
15		employees of the commission, by formal commission
16		action, such power and authority vested in the
17		commission by this chapter as the commission deems
18		reasonable and proper for the effective administration
19		of this chapter; and
20	[ <del>(11)</del> ]	(12) May solicit and accept grants, donations, and
21		contributions for deposit into the Kahoʻolawe

1 rehabilitation trust fund to support the purposes of this chapter." 2

SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 3 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
