A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:

5	HAWAII BROADBAND OFFICE
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
7	"Broadband" means high-speed internet access that is always
8	on, including mobile and fixed technologies.
9	"Office" means the Hawaii broadband office.
10	§ -2 Hawaii broadband office; establishment; state
11	broadband strategy officer; staff. (a) There is established
12	the Hawaii broadband office within the department of business,
13	economic development, and tourism.
14	(b) The director of business, economic development, and
15	tourism shall appoint, exempt from chapter 76, a state broadband
16	strategy officer to head the office. The department shall
17	employ any staff as may be necessary for the purposes of this

Any member of the council whose term has expired 5 may continue to serve as a holdover member until reappointment or until a successor is appointed. Any vacancies occurring in 6 7 the membership of the advisory council shall be filled for the 8 remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the 9 original appointments.

10 (C) The director of [commerce and consumer affairs] 11 business, economic development, and tourism, or the director's 12 designee, shall serve as chairperson of the council. The 13 chairperson may designate representatives of other interested 14 public or private sector organizations to serve as members of 15 the council, or as members of the work groups of the council to 16 address specified issues on an ad hoc basis, as the chairperson 17 deems necessary. The council shall meet at times as may be 18 called by the chairperson. Members and ad hoc members shall be 19 reimbursed for reasonable expenses, including travel expenses, 20 necessary for the performance of their duties. Administrative 21 support to the council shall be provided by the department of

There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 4 2020-2021 for the creation and staffing of the Hawaii broadband 5 6 office, including the establishment of two full-time equivalent 7 (2.00 FTE) positions that are exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii 8 Revised Statutes. 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 10 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes 11 of this Act. 12 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
