A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KEKAHA KAI STATE PARK.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that lifeguards act as
- 2 the primary responders for emergencies on shorelines and within
- 3 nearshore waters, where the majority of ocean recreational
- 4 activities take place. Lifeguards also provide injury control
- 5 and dispatch ocean rescue services. Moreover, the legislature
- 6 also finds that although Kua Bay is located within Kekaha Kai
- 7 state park in North Kona on the island of Hawaii and is under
- 8 the jurisdiction of the department of land and natural
- 9 resources, the State currently does not employ its own
- 10 lifeguards at Kua Bay.
- 11 The legislature further finds that the location of Kua Bay
- 12 between Kona and the resorts of the Kohala Coast and
- 13 improvements made to Kekaha Kai state park, such as a paved road
- 14 and comfort station, have led to more visits by locals and
- 15 tourists, making Kua Bay one of the most popular beaches in the
- 16 State. Consequently, the increase in visitation has been
- 17 accompanied by an increase in dangerous incidents, injuries, and

- 1 deaths, which could be mitigated by the placement of lifequards
- 2 at Kua Bay.
- 3 Emergency medical service patient care reported twenty-
- 4 eight calls from the Kua Bay area between 2013 and 2016,
- 5 fourteen in 2016 alone. Nineteen of the calls resulted in
- 6 hospitalization for traumatic injuries. Additionally, the
- 7 Hawaii Trauma Registry reports that seven spinal cord injuries
- 8 occurred in the Kua Bay Area from 2009 to 2013. According to
- 9 the department of health's emergency medical services and injury
- 10 prevention system branch's GIS database of fatal drownings,
- 11 three people have drowned in the Kua Bay area since 2013.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to save lives and prevent
- 13 injuries at Kua Bay by appropriating funds for employing four
- 14 lifeguards and purchasing necessary equipment.
- 15 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 18 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 19 2020-2021 for the establishment of four full time equivalent
- 20 (4.0 FTE) permanent ocean safety officers for Maniniowali beach
- 21 at Kua Bay in Kekaha Kai state park on the island of Hawaii;



- 1 provided that the county of Hawaii shall hire and provide
- 2 benefits for the four full-time equivalent (4.0 FTE) permanent
- 3 ocean safety officer positions established pursuant to this Act.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for the
- 9 department of land and natural resources to purchase equipment
- 10 to be used by state ocean safety officers in the course of their
- 11 work at Maniniowali beach at Kua Bay in Kekaha Kai state park on
- 12 the island of Hawaii; provided that the sum appropriated shall
- 13 be expended as follows:
- 14 (1) \$ for one lifequard tower;
- 15 (2) \$ for one all-terrain vehicle;
- **16** (3) \$ for radios;
- 17 (4) \$ for rescue equipment; and
- 18 (5) \$ for protective equipment.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 20 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
