# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 577-29, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

3 "§577-29 Mental health services relating to minors; diagnosis, counseling, and related activities. 4 (a) 5 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a minor who is 6 fourteen years of age or older may consent to mental health 7 treatment or counseling services provided by a licensed mental 8 health professional or mental health professional if, in the 9 opinion of the licensed mental health professional  $[\tau]$  or mental 10 health professional, the minor is mature enough to participate 11 intelligently in the mental health treatment or counseling 12 services; provided that the consent of the minor's parent or 13 legal quardian shall be required to prescribe medication to the 14 minor or to place the minor into an out-of-home or residential 15 treatment program.

16 (b) The mental health treatment or counseling services17 provided to a minor as authorized by this section shall include

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1 involvement of the minor's parent or legal guardian, unless the 2 licensed mental health professional  $[\tau]$  or the mental health professional, after consulting with the minor, determines that 3 4 the involvement would be inappropriate. The licensed mental health professional or the mental health professional shall 5 6 state in the client record whether and when the treating 7 clinician attempted to contact the minor's parent or legal guardian, and whether the attempt to contact was successful or 8 9 unsuccessful, or the reason why, in the treating licensed mental 10 health professional's opinion  $[\tau]$  or the mental health professional's opinion, it would be inappropriate to contact the 11 12 minor's parent or guardian. (c) A minor may not abrogate consent provided by a parent 13

15 (c) A minor may not abrogate consent provided by a parent 14 or legal guardian on the minor's behalf. A parent or legal 15 guardian may not abrogate consent given by the minor on the 16 minor's own behalf.

17 (d) If a minor consents to receive mental health treatment
18 or counseling services pursuant to this section, the minor shall
19 not be liable for payment.

20 (e) The minor's parent or legal guardian is not liable for21 payment for mental health treatment or counseling services

9	pursuant to chapter 453D, for licensed marriage and family		
10	therapists pursuant to chapter 451J, for clinical social workers		
11	pursuant to chapter 467E, for psychologists pursuant to chapter		
12	465, or for advanced practice registered nurses pursuant to		
13	chapter 457.		
14	"Mental health treatment or counseling services" means the		
15	provision of outpatient mental health treatment or counseling by		
16	a licensed mental health professional[-] or a mental health		
17	professional."		
18	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
20	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
