A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KALIHI TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that community planning			
2	in Hawaii has a long and significant history. The legislature			
3	further finds that a collaborative approach by stakeholders			
4	using successful, research-based solutions would improve			
5	Hawaii's community planning efforts and provide for the			
6	efficient use of Hawaii's resources in guiding community			
7	development in a responsible manner.			
8	On January 25, 2016, in his State of the State Address,			
9	Governor David Ige, provided the following statement relating to			
10	working with the community:			
11	When we govern in the right way, we conduct the			
12	people's business WITH the community, not against it or			
13	around it or without it. I've long had strong concerns			
14	about the way the redevelopment in Kakaako proceeded. So			
15	do a lot of people who felt left out. We have a great			
16	opportunity to learn from past experience and do things			

17 differently going forward. We have an immediate

opportunity to get it right in Kalihi. . . . Once the 1 correctional facility has been moved, we can take advantage 2 of the transit-oriented development opportunities created 3 by the rail transit system. . . . I intend to put together 4 5 a group of community leaders who will convene a series of community meetings to let Kalihi speak about what Kalihi 6 7 wants and what role it will play in the future of Honolulu. The land at Dillingham and Puuhale could be used for 8 9 affordable housing, open space for recreation, commercial development and the jobs that it would bring, education and 10 11 many other possibilities. And there are other state housing and mixed-use developments in various stages of 12 13 planning and development in Kalihi. In short, this is a 14 tremendous opportunity to reposition Kalihi for the future. 15 This Kalihi 21st Century initiative truly gives us the 16 opportunity to do community planning the right way. No one deserves this more than the people of Kalihi. This is long 17 18 overdue.

19 The purpose of this Act is to establish a temporary 20 commission to develop a framework of economic development and 21 community planning to effectively use the State's resources and 22 guide the future development of the Kalihi area.

Three business representatives chosen by the president 1 (11) of the senate from a list of at least nine businesses 2 in the Kalihi area; and 3 Three business representatives chosen by the speaker 4 (12) of the house from a list of at least nine businesses 5 in the Kalihi area. 6 (c) At the initial meeting of the commission, which shall 7 occur no later than sixty days after the effective date of this 8 Act, its members shall elect a chair, vice-chair, and any other 9 necessary officers from among the members. 10 No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii 11 (d) 12 Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's participation as a member of the commission. 13 The members shall not receive compensation for their 14 (e) services but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses, 15 including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their 16 duties under this Act. 17 SECTION 4. The commission shall create a comprehensive 18 19 development plan for the Kalihi area that will: (1) Focus on economic development, affordable housing and 20 rental units, education, healthcare, support for 21



strong families and support groups, poverty reduction, 1 crime reduction, and job creation as cornerstones in 2 its framework for the future development of Kalihi; 3 4 and Review potential areas for affordable housing, the 5 (2) relocation of the correctional facility currently 6 located in Kalihi, open space for recreation, 7 commercial development, employment opportunities, 8 education, shopping areas, business development, and 9 other opportunities for public housing and mixed-use 10 developments in various stages of planning and 11 12 development in Kalihi. SECTION 5. The commission shall submit its comprehensive 13 development plan, including any proposed legislation, to the 14 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 15 the regular session of 2022; provided that the commission shall 16 report its preliminary findings and recommendations relative to 17 the comprehensive development plan, including any proposed 18

19 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior20 to the convening of the regular sessions of 2020 and 2021.

In fulfilling its responsibilities, the commission shall
 consult, cooperate with, and seek advice from government
 officials, Kalihi area residents, and representatives from the
 public and private sectors, nonprofit social service
 organizations, and community-based organizations to establish a
 framework of economic development and community planning for the
 Kalihi area.

8 SECTION 6. The commission shall meet quarterly and may 9 hold public meetings as it deems necessary; provided that before 10 holding a public meeting the commission shall provide 11 publication of notice pursuant to section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised 12 Statutes. A majority of the commission members shall constitute 13 a quorum for conducting its necessary duties. The chair, at the 14 request of a majority of members, may hold special meetings.

15 SECTION 7. It is the intent of this Act to not jeopardize 16 the receipt of any federal aid. If any provision of this Act, 17 or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is 18 found to be in conflict with federal requirements that are a 19 prescribed condition for the allocation of federal funds to the 20 State, the provision shall be deemed void; provided that the 21 voided provision shall not affect other provisions or





applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
 voided provision or application, and to this end the provisions
 of this Act are severable.

4 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
