

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the continued 1 training and support of advanced practice registered nurses is 2 necessary to address the State's shortage of primary care 3 providers. Residents in rural areas often do not have direct 4 5 access to physicians. Hospitals have had to expend millions of dollars in order to address the medical issues associated with 6 people experiencing homelessness. For example, in 2017, 7 Hawaii's largest hospital reported that caring for homeless 8 patients had cost about \$90 million per year. Further, because 9 Medicaid did not reimburse all of the expenses, the hospital 10 absorbed almost \$40 million in expenses over a four-year period. 11 The purpose of this Act is to support the expansion of 12 primary medical care in the State by: (1) establishing a 13 residency program at the University of Hawaii center for nursing 14

15 to assist newly-graduated advanced practice registered nurses in 16 transitioning into clinical practice; (2) appropriating funds to 17 the University of Hawaii center for nursing to fund the advanced



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1	practice registered nurse residency program; and (3)		
2	appropriating funds to the University of Hawaii John A. Burns		
3	school of medicine for the advanced practice registered nurse		
4	residency loan repayment program.		
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
7	and to read as follows:		
8	"§304A- Advanced practice registered nurse residency		
9	program; establishment; center for nursing. (a) There is		
10	established within the University of Hawaii center for nursing		
11	an advanced practice registered nurse residency program. The		
12	residency program shall be a six- to nine-month program to		
13	provide eligible residency participants with clinical practice		
14	experience, with the aim of improving patient care.		
15	(b) The dean of the University of Hawaii school of nursing		
16	and dental hygiene shall be responsible for:		
17	(1) Developing and implementing the residency program in		
18	cooperation with the nursing profession, medical		
19	residency programs, hospitals, and clinics located		
20	throughout the State;		



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1	(2)	Overseeing the advanced practice registered nurses
2		supervising the eligible residency participants;
3	(3)	Ensuring that the advanced practice registered nurses
4		supervising the eligible residency participants
5		represent a wide range of specialties;
6	(4)	Using the Fellowship and Residency Electronic
7		Interactive Database Access System or developing an
8		alternate selection process and procedure to select
9		eligible residency participants;
10	(5)	Determining the education and training locations for
11		the residency program; provided that priority
12		consideration shall be given to communities in the
13		State where the population, facilities, number of
14		advanced practice registered nurses, and interest in
15		the nursing profession are conducive to success of the
16		residency program and will augment the provision of
17		health care in the State; and
18	(6)	Adopting rules pursuant to chapter 91 to effectuate
19		the purpose of this section, including determining
20		penalties for violations of subsection (c);
21		establishing the selection criteria for the stipend



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1	and loan repayment plans under subsections (d) and
2	(e), respectively; and detailing the notification and
3	process to accelerate loans provided under subsection
4	<u>(e).</u>
5	(c) Service commitment. Upon completion of the residency
6	program, eligible residency participants may be required to
7	commit to two years of full-time employment at the facility
8	where the residency occurred in the State. Failure to complete
9	the service commitment by the eligible residency participant may
10	result in financial penalties.
11	(d) An eligible residency participant may qualify for a
12	stipend as part of the residency program. Any stipend paid to
13	an eligible residency participant shall be paid from the general
14	medical education fund.
15	(e) An eligible residency participant may qualify for a
16	loan repayment plan through the advanced practice registered
17	nurse residency loan repayment program administered through the
18	University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine as
19	follows:

20	(1) The term of any loan to an eligible residency
21	participant shall not exceed seven years from the date



1		of the completion of the residency program by the
2		eligible residency participant or the date that the
3		eligible residency participant leaves full-time
4		practice in a qualified rural area, whichever is
5		sooner;
6	(2)	If the eligible residency participant leaves full-time
7		practice in a qualified rural area, the eligible
8		residency participant shall notify the University of
9		Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine within
10		days of leaving full-time practice and the loan shall
11		accelerate and become due in full within days
12		after the notice; and
13	(3)	Loans awarded from the advanced practice registered
14		nurse residency loan repayment program shall not
15		exceed per cent of the total tuition of the
16		residency program.
17	(f)	For the purposes of this section:
18	<u>"Eli</u>	gible residency participant" means a person who:
19	(1)	Graduated from an accredited graduate nursing program
20		recognized by the Accreditation Commission for



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1		Education in Nursing or the Commission on Collegiate
2		Nursing Education and:
3		(A) Holds a current unencumbered license as an
4		advanced practice registered nurse in this State
5		under chapter 457, or successfully obtains
6		licensure prior to participating in the residency
7		program; and
8		(B) Has less than twelve months of experience working
9		in their field of licensure; or
10	(2)	Applied for the residency program in the final
11		semester of study at an accredited advanced practice
12		registered nurse program or accredited graduate
13		nursing program recognized by the Accreditation
14		Commission for Education in Nursing or the Commission
15		on Collegiate Nursing Education, and successfully
16		obtains licensure prior to participating in the
17		residency program.
18	"Qua	lified rural area" means any area designated as a
19	medically	underserved area/population by the United States
20	<u>health re</u>	sources and services administration or an area for
21	which the	governor has requested designation as an exceptional



medically underserved area/population from the United States 1 2 health resources and services administration." 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 4 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 to carry 5 out the purposes of this Act; provided that no funds authorized 6 pursuant to this section shall be released unless the University 7 of Hawaii center for nursing secures dollar-for-dollar matching 8 9 funds for the residency program. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of 10 Hawaii center for nursing for the purposes of this Act. 11 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for the 14 advanced practice registered nurse residency loan repayment 15 16 program. 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine for the purposes of this 18
