The legislature finds that the statewide 2 parking program for persons with disabilities, established under 3 part III of chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant to 4 P.L. 100-641 (23 C.F.R. 1235), and administered by the 5 disability and communication access board, provides individuals 6 with mobility disabilities the opportunity to travel and park in accessible parking stalls.
